

# FORBES CRACKS SHOT-PUT MARK

*Ex-Trojan Flyer Shows All  
His Old-Time Speed*

SANTA BARBARA, April 29. (Exclusive)—Matters of major importance happened in a large way here today as Harry Trotter's U.C.L.A. Bruins walked off with the majority honors in the third annual Santa Barbara invitational track and field meet.

First of all Joe Forbes, Occidental College iron-man, lived up to his name by staging a brilliant comeback to establish a new world's record of 69ft. 4 1-4in. for the eight-pound shot.

Forbes was forced to go through the weight-pushing act twice when exacting A.A.U. officials rechecked the ball following the first announcement that Joe had set a mark at 71ft. 3in. The iron missile was found to be a gnat's mustache underweight so Joe came back on

die (Quick) Shands of Santa Barbara High.

Both the century races were run on close-cropped grass, which presented a firm but springy stage for the battle.

New meet records were established in every event with the exception of four, the high jump, shot, hammer and low hurdles. However, Jim Miller of U.C.L.A. tied the record in the low sticks with a mark of 24.7s.

Johnny Wall, former Roosevelt High miler, gave further proof that he is one of the best distance runners in Southern California by winning the two-mile in 9m. 54s. Wall runs for the love of running. He hitch-hiked to Santa Barbara from Los Angeles, arriving in Nick Carter's office around noontime. Wall was carrying an old suit case which held his track suit and a couple of cheese sandwiches.

Johnny started out for the meet at an early hour this morning and was forced to walk several miles en route. However, this only served to warm him up for the lengthy gallop.

Team honors went to U.C.L.A. as mentioned above. The Bruins gathered 34 points to beat Pomona and Oxy, who collected 13 and 10, respectively. Redlands and the Bruin frosh were next in line with 4, while Cal-Christian trailed with 3. Ventura Jaysee annexed the junior college division trophy, chalking up 9 points. California Poly was second with 4 points.

the field and the event was run off again.

### TIGHT BATTLE

Forbes received tight competition on both occasions from Hueston Harper of S.C.; Manley Edwards and Martin Orloff. The first time the event was staged Harper, also using the "light" ball, was credited with a 70ft. 7-8in. put, which was also quite a bit better than the recognized record of 68ft. 9-3-4in. set some years back by Herman Brix.

Following the double-shot put event Forbes placed third in the discus with a 140-foot heave and was fourth in the sixteen-pound shot, tossing the heavier weight 44ft. 9in.

Another brilliant exhibition was witnessed in the 100-yard dash in which Frankie Wykoff, ex-Trojan speedster, showed all his old-time form, winning from a fast field in the near-world's record time of 9.5s.

The special hundred, for high school and Jaysee dashmen, went to Carlton Thoms, black-haired Ventura Jaysee sensation. Thoms won by two yards in 9.6s, from Jim Stockdale of Cal Poly and Ed-
