

McCarthy Trims Rival as S.C. Beats Bruins

Jimmy Lu Valle Defeated in 47.9s.; Carpenter Shatters Houser's Record in Discus

Surprising practically no one, the Trojans swept to an easy 1041-6 to 26 5-6 win over U.C.L.A. in yesterday's second annual track meet between the cross-city rivals. Not more than 3000 track fans saw the affair which was staged in the Coliseum.

The meet ran very true to form with no upsets as far as first places were concerned. Johnny McCarthy won the feature quarter-mile dash from Jimmy LuValle in 47.9s. to avenge the licking the Bruin leader gave him last year.

CHANGES STYLE

LuValle adopted a different style of running. He ran his first furlong in the neighborhood of 22.8s., whereas his method in past races was to clip off a $\frac{1}{4}$ 21.8s. pace. Al Fitch took the lead from LuValle at the 100-yard mark and held it until the back stretch when Jimmy and McCarthy started to move up. Both swept by Fitch who faltered at the finish, dropping third place

to teammate Jim Cassin.

Five yards from the tape it seemed that possibly both Fitch and Cassin might "take" LuValle. McCarthy was already conceded the first place. For some screwy reason LuValle started to laugh just about then and strode in to win second as happy as a lark with an ear-to-ear grin lighting up his face. He wouldn't say what the joke was but admitted it had nothing to do with traveling salesmen.

THE CLOCKS

Three of the official watches caught McCarthy in 47.9s., the other in 48s.

Eight meet records fell by the wayside and two were tied. The best performance was that made by Kenny Carpenter, giant Trojan discus tosser. Carpenter won the event at 159ft. 8.9in. and then asked for three more tosses to try for a record. This was granted and Kenny tossed the wooden pie 161ft. 10in. Both marks bettered Bud Houser's S.C. record of 158ft. 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ in.

BRUINS BOW TO TROJANS

From that you have probably already guessed that the Bruins won very few first places, if any. In fact, that surmise is practically correct, for U.C.L.A. wound up the afternoon with one first place, Keith Carlin's 200ft. 4-in. toss in the javelin.

IMPROVING FAST

Carlin is duplicating Bill Helts's performance of last year when lanky Bill advanced the Bruins spear record each week from approximately 170ft. to well over 200ft. Carlin started the season at 180 and has improved five to ten feet each time out. Helts was shelved yesterday with an injured elbow. Both will throw next week in the Santa Barbara open.

Foy Draper won the hundred with ease in 9.8s. and took LaValle's measure in the furlong without a great deal of trouble. George Boone trailed Draper in the century and almost nipped LaValle for the second place in the 200. Foy's time was 21.8s.

MAD SCRAMBLE

The half-mile was a mad scramble with Ross Bush winning for S.C. by virtue of his final sprint. Bill Murphy won second for the Bruins beating Ediel Johnson by a nose. Johnson tied up as usual. Cartwright was a poor fourth. Bev Heim, Bruin runner, set a fast pace for the first lap. Bush was clocked in 1m. 54.8s., Murphy in 1m. 56s.

"Benny" Benevides won the mile in 4m. 20.4s. without batting an eyelash. He looks like the best miler on the Coast right now. Fred Lantz ran 4m. 7.1s. for second with Bill Nordli taking the third spot for U.C.L.A. Bill Smith, Trojan pace-maker, ran his usual 2m. 11s. half and then dropped out.

DWIRE UPSETS

Carl Dwire's second place in the high hurdles was considered an upset as the boy he trimmed, Bill Brown, has done 14.7s. Phil Cope, Troy sophomore, led all the way winning in 14.8s. Dwire's time couldn't have been worse than 14.8s.

Dwire hit the last low hurdle after running practically even with Hall, Paul and Strocher. The mishap caused him to lose his stride and the three Trojans finished ahead of him in that order. Hall's time was 23.8s.

That shouldn't be misconstrued as a Dwire alibi for as Irvia Tanner remarks, "The last hurdle is always the highest and toughest."

BRUINS GO EAST

After the meet Harry Trotter, Bruin coach, announced that Dada, Young, Vejar and LaValle would leave tomorrow for Des Moines where on Saturday they will defend their four-man mile relay championship.
