

WORLD'S HURDLE RECORD EQUALLED BY KIRKPATRICK

*Stiff Wind Nullifies Mark of Olympic Club's Star as
Seven A.A.U. Standards Fall*

LINCOLN (Neb.) July 3. (P)—Leroy Kirkpatrick, a California prep school youngster competing for the Olympic Club of San Francisco, scissored over the 120-meter high hurdles in the world-record equalling time of 14.2s. today, only to be thwarted of recognition by a stiff wind in the junior track and field championship of the Amateur Athletic Union, in the University of Nebraska Stadium here.

Kirkpatrick was not the only sufferer, for seven other meet marks were improved and two were equalled, and only record performances in the field events were recognized. The tall California star's loss, however, was the biggest, for he had tied the world standard, established by Percy Beard of the N.Y.A.C. at Oslo, Norway, last summer.

WINS DECISIVELY

Kirkpatrick, a hurdling stylist, won decisively over Forest Towns of the University of Georgia, who had won his trial heat in 14.4s. to beat the meet mark of 14.8s. set by Al Moreau of Louisiana State University in the 1933 meet at Chicago. The California ace also was under

the meet record in the trials, winning his heat in 14.5s.

Six of the record performances, officials announced, will stand, the ten-mile-an-hour breeze having been of no help to their makers.

Newell Rushforth, a tall youth from the University of Utah, representing the Salt Lake City Chamber of Commerce, cleared 6ft. 5 5-8in. in the high jump, to displace the old junior-mark established by Cornell Cooper of Pittsburgh at Chicago in 1933.

DISCUS RECORD

Big Chester Cruickshank of the Denver A.C. not only came up with a meet record performance of 153ft.

his in the steno throw, but was the only double winner of the day. Before getting around to wreck the steno mark of 1435, 2 1-8 in., set up by J. C. Peely of the Texas Neighborhood A.C. in 1933, the Denver heaver won the hammer throw with a toss of 1605, 2 1-8 in.

In addition to his pair of victories, Crankshaw landed second in the city-sta-stand weight, which went to Garret Noah of the Detroit Police Department, whose winning mark was 207, 60.

A new pole vault standard of 255, 7 3-8 in. was divided two ways between William Roy of Loyola at New Orleans and Jack Mangler, University of California star, who competed for the Olympic Club. Their achievements displaced the 237, 5/8 in. shared by John Wronowski of Ohio State and William Barton of Los Angeles and Southern California since last year's meet.

CLARK SETS MARK

A toss of 2171, 5/8 in. gave Woodrow Clark of the University of Richmond a new javelin record, wiping out the 2071, 8/8 in. accomplished by Johnny Molinar of the Olympic Club, last year. Stanley Johnson of M.I.T., competing for the Penn A.C. of Boston, led off 345, 1/8 in. more than two inches better than the meet record set by John Brooks, former University of Chicago Negro star in 1931, but the officials decided that the wind was a factor and declined to mark it up as a new record.

A 100m. performance in the 100 meters, matching the meet record figure, achieved by Ralph Stibel, former Kansas University sprinter, also was in vain because of the wind, and a 21.4 in the 200 meters around a turn by Bobby Parkard, promising youngster from Rockford (Ill.) High School which bettered the meet record of 24.8, was passed up for the same reason.

TITLE TO OLYMPIC

The same fate befell the 23.6 time of Dale Schofield of the Salt Lake City Chamber of Commerce, in the 200-meter low hurdles. His time tied the meet record established by Neve Lambertson of Nebraska in 1932.

Harold Nyland automatically was credited with a meet record in the 300-meter walk, held for the first time. His time was 54, 5/8 in.

The Olympic Club ran away with the team title on a point total of 48. The Denver A.C. finished second with 17 1/2 points, 13 of them provided by Crankshaw, with the Salt Lake City Chamber of Commerce third with 14.
