WORLD'S HURDLE RECORD EQUALLED BY KIRKPATRICK

Stiff Wind Nullifies Mark of Olympic Club's Star as Seven A.A.U. Standards Fall

LINCOLN (Neb.) July 3. (P)—Leroy Kirkpatrick, a California prep school youngster competing for the Olympic Club of San Francisco, scissored over the 120-meter high hurdles in the world-record equalling time of 14.2s. today, only to be thwarted of recognition by a stiff wind in the junior track and field championship of the Amateur Athletic Union, in the University of Nebraska Stadium here.

Kirkpatrick was not the only sufferer, for seven other meet marks were improved and two were equalled, and only record performances in the field events were recognized. The tall California star's loss, however, was the biggest, for he had tied the world standard, established by Percy Beard of the N.Y.A.C. at Oslo, Norway, last summer.

WINS DECISIVELY

Kirkpatrick, a hurdling stylist, won decisively over Forest Towns of the University of Georgia, who had won his trial heat in 14.4s, to beat the meet mark of 14.8s, set by Al Moreau of Louisiana State University in the 1933 meet at Chicago. The California ace also was under

the meet record in the trials, win-

Six of the record performances, officials announced, will stand, the ten-mile-an-hour breeze having been of no help to their makers.

Newell Rushforth, a tall youth from the University of Utah, representing the Salt Lake City Chamber of Commerce, cleared 6ft, 5 5-8in, in the high jump to displace the old junior-mark established by Cornell Cooper of Pittsburgh at Chicago in 1933.
