## Bud Day Vaults 13ft. 6in.

### Day Sprinters Win Relay in Fast Time; Thurber Jumps High

When a couple of boys are credited with vaults of 14ft. 6in. and when three more lads are said to have high jumped 8ft. 6in. or better in the first track meet of the season, things must certainly be booming in this altitude business.

But it was only handicap day at Occidental, in keeping with the general trend of things, and the Southern California Trojans surmounted some lousy obstacles to defeat the Oxy Tigers, 79-62, in the opening clincher of the year.

#### HANDICAPS HELP

Those record-breaking marks in the pole vault and in the high jump efforts were accomplished with the aid of generous allowances, with the favorites and scratch entrants being relegated to out-of-the-money classification.

John Mosher and the winning sophomore, Loring (Bud) Day, vaulted 13ft. 6in. They had fifteen-inch allowances, while Earle Meadows, the scratch man, likewise did 13ft. 6in. All represented Troy.

Vernon Ogil, Oxy's sophomore, won the high jump at 8ft. 7in. with a five-inch allowance, while Ambrose Schindler of S.C. and Claude Kilday of Oxy tied for second at 8ft. 6in. with six and eight-inch handicaps, respectively. Delos Thurber, Southern California's splendid young leaper, actually cleared 8ft. 6in., but he was at scratch.

#### OXY SPRINTERS GOOD

It took Southern California's sophomore talent, Oxy's sprint regular team and Starter Art Badernoch to make it an exciting afternoon.

The sophomores' Pole Vaulting Day, High Jumped Thurber and Miller Ned Jensen, were much in evidence. Another second-year hope, Tex Miller, flipped the javelin 187ft. 5in., but was out of the money.

Oxy's sprinters, Kilday, Langsdorf, Dick Johnson and Jerry Isett, roared away with a four-man-440 race in 42.6s., with Isett leading the Trojan dashman, George Boone, by a good six yards on the anchor turn. The Trojans were supposed to be handicapped by running in lane two, but they could never get ahead of the Tigers to cut in, anyway. Isett's splendid finish would have guaranteed victory in any case.

#### STARTER'S EFFORT GOOD

Then Badernoch's 100-yard dash effort was worthy of feature billing.

Two false starts delayed matters, and then Isett jumped the gun and was away in front with no recall being sounded. When the runners hit the seventy-five-yard marker another shot bounced out and Kilday and Boone quit. But Al Pisch rolled ahead to a 5.7s. victory with Langsdorf of Oxy next and Adrian Taylor of Troy third. Isett, who slowed up when the recall gun went off, was far back. Pisch also capped the 100 in 21.6s. for the only double victory.

Some of the Trojans, notably For Draper, Kenny Carpenter, and Bill Bolton, did not compete.

#### TRY NEW EVENTS

Others ran in different events, James Cassin capping the half-mile in 1m. 58.2s. Ross Bush, the 440 king, figured in a three-way tie for first honors in the mile with Jensen and Pete Zamperini.

One of the boys who didn't even figure in the money was cause for more joy appearing in Coach Dean Crowell's already jubilant face. He was Clarence Schleiher, making the first appearance of his return engagement at Troy in the shot put. Schleiher, an I.C.A.A.A. place winner in 1929, has been out of college since, but threw the bulb 47ft. 3in. yesterday, showing that he is a "solid contender," as they say at Arcadia, in the collegiate weight picture.
