

Smallwood Runs Fast Quarter in Troy Meet

Juniors Cop Interclass Title From Seniors; Former Venturan Does 48.5s., Beating Cassin

Harold Smallwood, a product of Ventura J. C., led the list as University of Southern California tracksters turned in splendid early season marks yesterday on Bovard Field in the interclass track meet, captured by the juniors.

Smallwood led the way to the tape in the quarter-mile in 48.5s., beating Jimmy Cassin by five yards.

SENIORS CLOSE

The juniors piled up 47 points. Seniors had 46½, sophomores 33½ and frosh trailed with 16.

Two Bovard Field marks fell yesterday with Phil Cope romping away to victory in the 120-yard high hurdles in 14.7s., shading the mark of 14.8s. set last year by Cope and Roy Staley. The latter finished second yesterday.

CARPENTER SETS MARK

The other record went to Kenny Carpenter, Uncle Sam's leading discus hope, when he flipped the platter 164ft. 9in. Carpenter had five throws past the 157ft. marker.

Coach Dean Cromwell was well satisfied with the marks recorded by his boys, and figures, rightly, that if they did that well on March 20 they should be breaking world's records by June.

Lanky Al Fitch continued his fine work in the dashes when he copped both events in better than even time.

Mathews with Foy Draper third in the century. The furlong had Draper in second spot and Cassin third. The century time was 9.8s., while the 220 was 21.9s.
