

Troy Cindermen Beat Bruins; Duda Shines

Westwood "440" Man Pulls Surprise in Quarter and Relay, but S.C. Wins, $74\frac{1}{2}$ to $56\frac{1}{2}$

It takes something entirely out of the ordinary to make a sick man well in less than a minute and when Ed Duda ran a lap in 47.4s. to give U.C.L.A. a victory in the relay over the University of Southern California yesterday it made Harry Trotter, ailing Bruin coach, a well man and no mistake.

What if the Trojans, minus several stars, did win the meet, $74\frac{1}{2}$ to $56\frac{1}{2}$ —the Bruins won seven first places and, for a topper, slew the mighty Trojans in the relay in the record-breaking time of 3m. 15.3s.

No wonder Harry got well!

Duda's sensational quarter, his second outstanding performance for the afternoon at that distance, for he won the regular quarter-mile race from Johnny Cassin in 48.7s., was a remarkable bit of work.

FITCH GETS EDGE

His three team-mates, Marion Grimes, Sinclair Lott and Bob Young, had finished even with Trojans Bonebrake, Olson and Cassin but a pass of the baton that was none too good gave Trojan Al Fitch, who had been saved for just this

race, a bit of an advantage on the Bruin runner.

Fitch, relying on his freshness and his sprinting ability, just held Duda pretty well even until the middle of the last turn when the battling Bruin began to pour it on. Neck and neck they battled down the home stretch with the astounded handful of spectators startled out of their seats by the mad yells of the Bruin rooters. Duda was on the outside, battling with everything he had—and he had just enough to plunge across the finish line a foot ahead of the Trojan runner—who ran his lap in the excellent time of 47.5s.

It was a marvelous victory.

With some of the Trojan stars

missing, the rest of the gang out-did themselves. George Boone helped himself to the only double victory of the day, capturing both sprints handily in 9.8s. and 21.7s. Lloyd Olson beat 15s. for the first time in his life to win the high hurdles in 14.8s., although it took a nose dive at the tape to give him the nod over U.C.L.A.'s Fred Anderson.

Then there was Bud Spicer of S.C. who has been threatening to do something for a long time and finally cleared 6ft. 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. to capture the high jump and Freddy Lantz, the two-miler who runs the mile, found out how to do it and galloped the four laps in 4m. 21.3s., while Ned Jensen, who switched events with Lantz, won the two-mile in something less than 10m.

FUNK WINS SHOT

The Bruins were not without their stars. Big Freddy Funk came out of the doldrums to heave the shot better than 47ft. and win that event, while Dick Valentine showed once more that right living is not without its reward when he joggled the cross bar at 13ft. 9in. but it stayed on the pegs and he captured the event.

The half-mile, scheduled to be the hot event of the afternoon was exactly as advertised but U.C.L.A.'s Bob Young had entirely too much strength for Estel Johnson, running his first half of the year, and won eased up in 1m. 56.2s. Bruin Captain Bill Murphy showed signs of a return to form by finishing a strong third in the half. Milton Tyre, who throws the discus in practice from the Westwood campus halfway to the ocean but has never seemed to be able to do it in a meet, came through with a nice win in the platter event while bounding little Kenji Marumoto handed the Bruins a surprise first place in the broad jump.

The varsity events were preceded by the freshman of the two schools and the Trojans won handily, 77 to 54, but there were several excellent performances, notably a half-mile in under 3m. by Taylor of U.C.L.A., a rousing 50.8s. quarter by his team-mate, Leaman, and a winning toss of over 48ft. in the shot by Fisher of the Trojans.
