## LEADS MILE

### Pasadena Jaysee Places Second

Former Prep Champion Runs

Distance in 4m. 21.7s.

Robinson Stars

SANTA BARBARA, May 9. (Exclusive)—Before a throng that filled Peabody Stadium of the Santa Barbara High School, the sixth annual Santa Barbara open track and field meet was held this afternoon with 200-odd California athletes participating.

In the open division University of California at Los Angeles won with 23 points, somewhat crowded in accumulation by Pasadena Junior College with 17 points. San Diego State was third with 10 points, Santa Barbara State fourth with 9, Compton Junior College, 8½, U.S.C. fresh, 6; Loyola, 5; Olympic Club, 5; Caltech, 4; Mexican Athletic Association of Los Angeles, 4. In the junior college division, Pasadena stepped out ahead with 11 points, followed by Compton, 7; Taft, 3; Miramonte, 1.

#### PORTONOVA SETS MARK

Three track records were broken. Zamperini, running unattached, did the mile in 4m. 21.7s., bettering the record of 4m. 24.4s. set by Hooper of Santa Barbara State in 1934. Portonovo, in the colors of Pasadena Junior College, running the two-mile in 9m. 43.3s., bettered the old track record of 9m. 54s. set several years ago by John Wall. Yeager of Santa Barbara State set a new record of 24.1s. for the 220 low hurdles, replacing a record set by Norman Paul of U.S.C. at 24.7s. For the second time in the meet's history, Mack Robinson of Pasadena Junior College was high-point man, this year acquiring 11 points.

#### WYKOFF LOSES

Two athletes from whom much had been expected were not in record-setting form. Cornelius Johnson, unattached, formerly Compton Junior College, was through a 6ft. 5½in. in the high jump, while Frank Wykoff of Carpinteria, unattached, was beaten by inches in the hundred.
