## Owens, Metcalfe Lead Sprint

Veteran Runs Third in 100 Behind Two Sensational Colored Flyers

NEW YORK, July 11. (P)—Jesse Owens, Ohio State's triple Olympic threat, led America's athletic march toward Berlin today by winning two of the three events decided today in the opening half of the final United States track and field tryouts.

The Negro athlete made it look easy as he finished off two-thirds of his competitive job. He whipped his dusky rival from Marquette, Ralph Metcalfe, by a full yard in the final of the 100-meter dash, timed in 10.4s., and then won the broad jump with the second of his two efforts, measuring 25ft, 10 3-4in, Tomorrow Owens will seek his third Olympic berth in the 200 meters.

#### CROWD DISAPPOINTS

Today's competition, inaugurating the new Randall's Island Stadium, located under the newly dedicated Triborough bridge, began in blistering hot weather, finished between showers.
