## Prospects Not Promising for Another Unbeaten Track Team at Southern California Although All Hope Not Lost

San Francison track writers are incifned to pooh pooh the e-season announcemients that the University of Southern Call-
 swept over ecerything by overwhelming focores, lneluding an N.C.A.A. championship with the record number of 1031 J points. The boys up north are apparently trying to build Deaw CromWell's team up bieger than ever, no doubt with the thought that the bigger the bulldut the higger will be the fall if or colfornia should unset the Stanford or Calfornia should upset the Trojans in elther dual meet or NC.A.A. competition.

Best why to figure a track team's probabie strength is to take its outrianding showing of the past season, see what is lost and what is returning and then size up the potentallifes of the new boys. Best showing of the Trofani in 1936, of course, was in the N.C.A.A.
 meet when the boys scored in fourteen events and displayed their all-around strength to the fullest extent. A study of the summary of the bir championship meet shows that half of the 1001.3 points are lost for the 1037 team. To be exact, boys representing 51.3 pointe return; athletes who made 52 are lost. The loit points In clude slx that George Boone made in the hop, step and jump, because although Grorge is back on the S.C track team the event is not uned in the N.C.A.A. except during Olympic years.

Thren Good Runners Missing
On the track the Southern Californians loge 30 pointi, scored mainly by Foy Draper in the sprints and by Al Fitch and Hal Smallwood in the quarter-mile. Nineteen of the points made on the track return, and if you will consult the chart below you will see that the bpys who made these points are good bets to score fust as many or more this year.

The Trojans lost 22 of their fleld event points, the blggest Ioss being Ken Carpenter's flrst in the discus throw, but $22.1-3$ pointif are returning. Field event strength this year as last will again be exceptionally potent in the pole vault with Earle Meadows, the Oympic champ, and Bill Seftom, and in the broad tump, with three N.C.A.A. place winners last year in Boone, Don Sklmer and Clark Crane.

With the improvement that we may reasonably expect from the boys after a year of experience, it is logical to expect that the returning 5113 points may expand to ahout 60 for the 1937 championships. Frequently this is enough to win the N.C.A.A. However, both Callfornin and Stanford will be greatly Improved this yenr and may be athe to beat this flgare, the Bearil liaving been handicapped last season by a great many injuries and III neskes, while the Indians were in their only bad slump of the past decade. need abotit Th polnts. Looking to the new men for them, we find only Phil Gaspar, sophomore discun thrower, and Bob Fisher, soph shot putter, as possibillties on the basls of their work last year. Gaspar hat one throw in 1336 of 160 ft . 0in., while Finher at one time hit 48 ft . 3 h in the sthet. Aetife from these boys the 36 freshman team, weakeit yoarling gquad in the pant fifteen years at Troy, appears to give Cromwell little hope.

Prowpects Not Promislig
The proppects for another unbeaten Trolan track team therefare are not too promising at present. Even with half their N.C.A.A. points gone, the Southern Californlans have far more returning than any other unlversity. Their potentialities for developing new point winurs this season are not good, however, and because of thls the Trolans, still rating the ravored spot at the start of the year, may not be sble to go through without one or two downlatls during the blg meets to come
