

TROJAN TRACK TEAM

ROUTES STANFORD, 94-36

Caving in under the onslaught of the greatest dual meet track team in the nation, Stanford collapsed at the Coliseum yesterday afternoon and was beaten, 94 1-6 to 36 5-6, by Southern California.

Ten thousand fans saw the Indians receipt for the worst licking ever given them by the Trojans in thirty years of competition. Previous high was the 88-to-43 pasting in 1935.

WULFF TIES THURBER

Dink Templeton's proteges got only three clear first places. These came with Ray Malott in the 440, Tom Montgomery in the shot and Pete Zagar in the discus. Russ Wulff managed to tie Delos Thurber for first in the high jump.

Trojans swept only one event, the javelin, but bagged first and second in six others.

Stanford suffered a tough break when Stan Hiserman, sure of second in the low hurdles, fell after hitting the next to last barrier. Quarter-miler Williamson also tumbled in the 440 and was spiked on the arm by

Trojan Albright, who fell over him. Neither would have placed anyway.

FORTY-YARD LEAD

Anticipated excitement surrounding the mile run failed to materialize when Edson Burrows, lanky Stanford runner, couldn't keep within shooting distance of Louis Zamperini. The great Trojan distance star won in 4m. 16s., while the real feature of the race was the battle between Burrows and Ned Jensen for second place, forty yards behind the flying Zamperini. Burrows, after being passed by Jensen on the far turn of the final lap, managed to come up and edge out Ned by a scant yard at the tape.

Neither Zamperini nor Burrows appeared for the two-mile, but unexpectedly each toed the

mark for the 880. Trojan Phil Roulac won in 1m. 54.9s., largely because officials refused to recognize Zamperini's attempt to finish in a tie with his teammate. Burrows finished last in a field of four starters.

Only double winner of the day was Adrian Talley, S. C. sprint ace, who copped the 100 in 9.7s. and came back later to run the furlong in 21.2s.
