

S.C. Takes Top Honors

Six Records Broken as Southern California Captures Championship

SEATTLE, May 20. (AP)—Running true to form, the national champion University of Southern California Trojans took home their fourth consecutive Pacific Coast Conference track and field title in their red-and-gold tunics today.

The record shattering gave the crowd of 6000 persons plenty to shout about.

Six were broken, two others tied as the cream of far-western cinder talent ran, leaped and tossed under alternately cloudy and sunny skies.

The Trojans amassed 67 points to lead the other nine conference teams. Stanford was second with 45 points; California had 38; Washington State, 30; Oregon, 15½; U.C.L.A., 13; Montana, 7; Oregon State, 5; Washington, 2½, and Idaho, 2.

JEFFREY WINS SPRINTS

Stanford's Capt. Clyde Jeffrey led the record assault. He tied the 100-yard dash record of 9.7s. in a morning qualifying heat. In the afternoon he shaved the mark by a tenth of a second. A little later he won the 220-yard dash, tying the conference meet mark of 21s.

A record that stood for 13 years tumbled before Washington State College's fleet-footed Dixie Garner. He ran the two-mile in 9m. 22.1s. The old mark, 9m. 30.4s., was set by Gillette of Montana in 1926.

Red-headed Earl Vickery of S.C. did the 220-yard low hurdles in 23.3s. to set a new conference meet mark. The old mark of 23.4s. was set by Robinson of Oregon last year.

Lou Zamperini of S.C. broke the first record of the day when he negotiated the mile in 4m. 16.3s., bettering the old mark of 4m. 17.9s. set last year by Burrows of Stanford.

BROWN WINS JAVELIN

An upset occurred in the shot-put, where Stanford's giants, Stan Anderson and Bill Wohle, were expected to run one-two. They finished in that order, but it was second-third, because blond Herb Michael of California tossed the iron ball 52ft. 4½in. to establish a new conference meet record. The old mark of 52ft. 1¾in. was set by Reynolds of Stanford in 1937. Anderson came in at 52ft. and Wohle at 51ft.

Boyd Brown of Oregon, boy whose right thumb is severed at the first joint, won the javelin event at 224ft. 1¾in. This was an inch and three-quarters better than Trojan Bob Peoples' best heave of 223ft. 11¾in. Both were well over the former record.
