

# Peoples and Vickery Shine

Entire S.C. Entry List Makes Grade for I.C.4-A. Finals Today

NEW YORK, May 26. (AP)—The University of Southern California's track and field men, who had threatened to make a walkaway of the team race in the 63rd I.C.4-A. championships, backed up that threat with unbeatable arguments today.

In the opening day's qualifying competition at Triborough Stadium, the Trojans tried for 15 places in tomorrow's finals and semifinals and won them all. The Pacific Coast Conference champions also established two new meet records.

## PEOPLES SETS MARK

Bob Peoples, U.S.C. sophomore from Oklahoma City, was in front all by himself in the javelin throw, tossing the spear for a new meet mark of 223ft. 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ in., 14in. better than the eight-year-old standard credited to Ken Churchill of California. Earl Vickery, last year's runner-up, skimmed the low hurdles to finish the 220 yards in 23.1s., one-tenth under the former record set in 1937 by Ham Hucker of Cornell.

The Trojans sent Peoples, Reed Trusel and Hugo de Groot into the javelin final; Phil Gaspar and Art Wrotnowski into the discus final and Mickey Anderson, Payton Jordan and Barney Willis into the semifinals of the century. Jordan also won a place in the 220 semifinals.

## FISHER M'NEAL IN SHOT

Others who qualified for U.S.C. for tomorrow's program, when 16 titles will be decided, were Jim Humphrey with a 14.6s. high hurdles performance, the best of the day; Erwin Miller and Howard Upton in the 440, and Bob Fisher and Don McNeil, last fall's football captain, in the shot-put.

Miller, Jim Herbert of New York University, which placed 10 men for the second-best showing, and Wes Wallace of Fordham all made the grade in the quarter-mile and thereby won another crack at long John Woodruff.

## WOODRUFF LOAFS

The giant Pittsburgh senior took his heat in 48.4s. and then loafed through a half-mile in 1m. 57s. to qualify for defense of both his individual titles, with the day's fastest trials. Tomorrow, in addition to the 440 and 880, the Negro will anchor Pitt's mile relay team against Southern California, California, N.Y.U. and Cornell.
