PARIS, June 16. (P)—Don Mo-Neill, 13th ranking American from Oklahoma City, qualified today to match strokes with Bobby Riggs, the United States No. 1 amateur, in the singles finals of the French hard courts tennis championships at Roland Garros Stadium Sunday.

Playing brilliantly at the start and then coming back after tiring in the third set, McNeill eliminated Elwood Cooke of Portland, Or. 62, 75, 79, 62. Riggs earned his finals brackets yesterday in straight sets over Otto Szigeti of Hungary.
