

Olympic Club Nabs Crown

Huntington Beach Lad Ties, Breaks Records in Winning Two Sprints

FRESNO, June 28.—All predictions regarding the class of the athletes assembled here for the 52nd National A.A.U. carnival and the speed of the Radcliffe Stadium track were proven mere understatements tonight with the running of the junior championships.

Seven national junior records were cracked and an eighth tied by a group of champions such as no national meet has ever produced in one year. The Olympic Club won team honors from the Southern California A.A. but far outshining the team rivalry were the individual performances on the 100 meters, 200 meters, 400 meters, 800 meters, 5000 meters, 200-meter hurdles, 400-meter hurdles and shot-put.

MORRIS STARS

Five of the record-breaking and tying stunts were credited to Southern California's Bobby Madrid, Ed Morris, Cliff Bourland and Carl McBain.

Outstanding among the stars was Huntington Beach's Eddie Morris, who, in order, tied the 100 meter mark, broke the 200 meter record and then immediately broke the 300 record he had just established in a heat. Morris hinted at what was to come when he stepped the first 200 meter heat in 19.5s. and then followed with a record tying 19.4s. to defeat Negro Leo Tarrant of Alabama State. In his heat of the 300 meter race he strided to a 21s. flat mark which broke the 21.2s. record first established by Bob Rodenkirchen and Robert Graham in 1936, tied by Ed Sullivan in 1937 and again by Eugene Littler last year.

MOORE LOSES

The number of men who have shot at this mark and merely tied it but adds luster to Morris' next feat, which was to go to work in earnest in the finals and flash a 20.6s. time on the board. This was not allowed because of a following wind.

The best duel of the evening saw Paul Moore and Jim Kehoe, of the Washington A.A., match strides for the last 75 yards of the 800 meter event. It was a thrilling drive down the stretch with Kehoe a whisker in front in the new record time of 1m. 51.2s.

RECORD ORGY

Don Lash had little difficulty winning the senior-junior 10,000 meter run by 200 yards in the mediocre time of 32m. 29.2s. and then the records began to fall when Stanford's Stan Anderson snatched the 16-pound shot 53 ft. 4-in. to top George Theodorakus' mark of 53 ft. 4.8-in. established in 1933.

Richard Browning of the Olympic Club shaded the 200-meter hurdle mark by .1 second with a time of 21.4s. The old record was shared by Heye Lambertas and C. L. Becher, who made their efforts in 1933 and 1937, respectively.

Pasadena's Bobby Madrid gave the 500-meter record a solid walloping when he knocked 11.1s. off the 15m. 22.8s. mark made by Dal Smith of Kansas State Teachers in 1934. Madrid won by over 300 yards and could have cut his time considerably if pressed at all.

Cliff Bourland, ineligible Trojan competing for the S.C.A.A., cracked the 400-meter record with a characteristic sprint finish that left his field tied. He bettered the 1937 mark established by Paul Sanders, Rice Institute, by a full second to win off by himself in 47.4s.

Bruce Coe captain Carl McBain slaughtered the 400-meter hurdle record when he stepped away

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from all competition to win in the very fast time of 52.3s. The old record was made by Navy's Joe Patterson in 1936.

LOVVORN WINS

Drawing first blood for Southern California, Froggie Lovvorn, Pepperdine College quarter and half-miler, outsprinted S.C.A.A.'s Art Cazares to win the 1500-meter race. It was the first time Lovvorn has run the metric mile. He loped along easily in third place until 100 yards from the finish, when he uncorked a finish Cazares could not match. The time, 4m. 4s., was comparatively slow.

TURNER TAKES JUMP

With the help of Bruin Pat Turner, the Olympic Club gathered 24 points with the first three places in the broad jump, to stop the S.C.A.A. parade. Turner jumped 24ft. 7 1/2 in. to win. Ray Atzet, S.C.A.A., was fourth and Pasadena's Bob Gillette sixth. Bonnifield, Anderson and Cornett gave the San Francisco club 18 more points in the discus and hopes that the Southern California Athletic Club could win the junior meet championship faded rapidly.
