

# Weed and Johnson Crack Two Records in Time-Trial Meet

Turning on the pressure for the California track meet two weeks hence, Southern California runners yesterday broke two Bovard Field records as Coach Dean Cromwell ordered his charges to go all out in time-trial events.

Leroy Weed, ace distance man, clipped 7.2s. off the old two-mile mark of 9m. 21.3s. set in 1939 by Louie Zamperini. Weed was clocked in the sensational time of 9m. 14.1s.

Sam Johnson ran the 140-yard low hurdles in 14.8s. to break Earl Vickery's record of 15s. flat established in 1938.

One of the surprises of the day was the leap of 6ft. 8in. turned in by Searles Tally in the high jump, a mark which

ties the field record set last year by Johnny Wilson. For Tally it was three inches higher than he's ever jumped before.

Jack Trout, hailed as the team's best sprinter, captured the 100 in 9.8s., finishing two yards ahead of Howard Callanan.
