

Weed Scores Double Win

Cromwell's Champions Flash Too Much Power for California Team

BERKELEY, April 11. (U.P.) University of Southern California's track team, presumably the greatest in the nation, won 10 events and set three new meet records today to defeat University of California, 81 2/3 to 49 1/3.

The Trojans, with vastly superior strength in depth, won all the events they were scheduled to win and some more besides. California, with probably the second best team in the country, suffered a decisive blow at the outset by losing its star middle-distance man, Grover Klemmer.

WEED VICTOR

Slender Leroy Weed, one of the best college milers in the country, sent S.C. off in winning fashion by an easy victory in the four-lap event opening the meet. He was clocked in 4m. 19s. on an obviously slow track at Edwards Stadium.

Weed, ace distance man of the Coast and national defending champion Trojan team, sprinted into the lead just before the last lap and stayed off a final bid by the Bears' George Richards to win by 20 yards. Bob Weyand of California was third. The Trojans opened the meet as odds-on favorites to defeat the Bears for the 17th consecutive year.

KLEMMER OUT

California hopes were shattered and its team future given a severe blow when its world record quarter-miler, Grover Klemmer, pulled a muscle and dropped out of the event shortly after the start.

Veteran Cliff Bourland, closing swiftly, won the event for the Trojans and his teammate, Hubie Kerns, ran second. The time was 47.3s. California, instead of a first place expected from the luckless Klemmer, managed to take third position when Duane Lewis outnosed a Trojan rival.

BREAKS STRIDE

Klemmer, up with the pace at the start of the 440, broke stride and pulled up at about 80 yards while the rest of the field sped on. The blond speedster had lined up with his right thigh taped.

As expected, Harold Davis of California ran away from his rivals in the 100-yard dash. He finished with a couple of yards to spare in 9.7s. Jack Trout and Howard Cailanan ran second and third, respectively, for the Trojans, with the latter nosing out the Bears' Jim Jurkovich by a matter of an inch or so.

The Trojans scored firsts in the 120-yard hurdles and the half-mile run, John Biewener winning the high barriers event in 14.8s. and Warren Smith sprinting home in the 880-yard test in 1m. 57s.

California's Davis became the first double winner by racing off with the 220-yard dash in 21.6s.

The Trojans' durable Leroy Weed came up with the meet's iron-man stunt by winning the two-mile run, not long after he had galloped to first place in the mile race.

He loped in with a sixty-yard lead in the long grind in a time
