

Warmerdam Hits New Outdoor Vault Ceiling

**Piedmont Teacher Clears 15ft. 6⁷/₈in.
in Berkeley Meet; Weed Runs 9m. 4.6s.**

BERKELEY, May 2. (AP)—Cornelius (Wonderman) Warmerdam, the new American eagle, soared to a new world record again today. The Piedmont study-hall professor pole-vaulted over the crossbar at 15ft. 6⁷/₈in., crashing all existing outdoor records.

Although Warmerdam has a higher indoor mark, 15ft. 7¹/₂in., made in Boston on January 14, it was made indoors. When and if the international federation meets to compare records, it is probable the indoor mark will not be given the same consideration as the standardized outdoor mark. Warmerdam himself considers this his world record.

MARK CRACKED

It cracked the mark he set last June 6 at Compton, of 15ft. 5¹/₂in. Among other things, it also broke the Pacific Association meet record, in which he was competing, and the stadium record, all held by none other than himself.

It was his 19th official clearance of 15 feet or better, or 21 including a pair of exhibition leaps. No man in the world, except the blond, lithe Warmerdam, ever has moved over 15 feet. Warmerdam first leaped 15ft. 1¹/₂in. and on his third try jackknifed over for the new world mark. Three tries at 15ft. 9in. were close.

The second fastest two-mile on the Pacific Coast was won by Leroy Weed of S.C. by three scant yards over Art Cazares of Fresno. After a comparatively slow mile of 4m. 40s., the boys blistered the track with Weed taking command in the last lap to win in 9m. 4.6s., for a new meet and stadium record. Because S.C. is not a member of the Pacific Association, Cazares was awarded the official first place and the meet record, of 9m. 5.2s.

DAVIS NIPS SMITH

Harold Davis again proved himself the fastest fellow on the Coast when he pounded ahead of San Jose's Billy Smith in the 100-yard dash, winning by four feet, and then whipping S.C.'s Hubert Kerns and Cliff Bourland in the 220. In the century, Davis was behind for 70 yards but his charging "gather" hurtled him into the tape a winner. In the furlong, Kerns was never in con-

tention but faltered 40 yards from the finish and pulled up lame, though limping across to finish fourth. Frank Kaiser of Sacramento Junior College finished a surprising second. Davis' times were 9.7s. and 21s flat.

BOURLAND WINS

Bourland won the 440-yard dash in 46.9s., also an unofficial P.A. record, and Kaiser was second in 47.6s. One of the meet's big upsets saw John Fulton, Stanford freshman, win by a yard over Thelmo Knowles of San Jose, in 1m. 54.7s.

High point man of the meet was the Olympic Club colossus, huge Thom (Thumb) Montgomery, who came up from Arizona to compete. The 6-foot 8¹/₂-inch giant won the 56-pound weight.
