

# Trojan Trackmen Grab Seventh Coast Crown

SEATTLE, May 30. (AP)—Never finishing worse than third in the 12 events in which they scored, the University of Southern California Trojans won their seventh consecutive Pacific Coast Conference track and field meet today with 79 points.

The Trojans won five firsts, shared another and finished two-three in five other events. They failed to place in the javelin and discus, and didn't enter their ace two-miler, Leroy Weed, because "we didn't need the points and Weed's tired." He already had won the mile.

## Molinari, Gordon in Golf Final

SACRAMENTO, May 30. (AP)—Jim Molinari, colorful San Francisco policeman who has been runner-up in this tournament twice, and Phil Gordon of Oakland, finalist in the 1938 National public links championship, will play for the Northern California amateur golf title at Del Paso Country Club here tomorrow.

They came through two rounds of match here today, Molinari defeating Einar Hansen of Daly City, 5 and 4, and then knocking out Robert Roos Jr., San Francisco, on the 20th hole of their afternoon semifinal.

Gordon had a narrow escape but pulled through against 16-year-old Bob Unthank of Alameda, one up, in the morning, then really poured it on to defeat the State champion, Ernie Pieper Jr., San Jose, in the afternoon, 3 and 2. Gordon was two under par in

Washington, Northern Division champion, 21½; Idaho, 14½; Oregon State, 10½; Washington State and Montana, 9 each; U.C.L.A., 7½, and Oregon, 5½.

Only one Coast Conference record was equaled and none was broken.

Hal Davis, currently the "fastest human" from the University of California, dominated both dashes. He tied the conference mark for the 100-yard dash by hustling the distance in 9.6s. to share the record set by Clyde Jeffrey of Stanford here in 1939. A headwind may have slowed him up from his 9.4s. pace in the Fresno Relays May 16.

Davis also copped the 220, coming in six yards ahead of Cliff Bourland of S.C., in 21.6s., or 6/10 of a second off the record.

Thriller of the meet was the two-mile.

It was a battle between Ralph Dewey, husky Californian, and gaunt Vic Dyrgall of Idaho. Dewey finally won at the tape by the thickness of his chest as they both gasped across. The time was 9m. 20.3s., or more than seven seconds off the record. Dyrgall led after seven laps by only two paces. Dewey caught him at the end of the final turn and they both wobbled rubber-legged, neck-and-neck to the finish.

Southern California's Cliff Bourland won the 440 and ran the winning leg of the mile relay. Bourland was puffing his cheeks like twin balloons as he won the quarter in 47.3s. by five yards over teammate John Wachtler, who in turn just nipped Johnny Long of Washington.
