

Troy Spikemen Better Two Relays Records

Pretty much as expected, Coach Dean Cromwell's S.C. track and field squad skipped off with the lion's share of the medals yesterday in the 13th annual Southern California College Relays held at Pomona College.

The vaunted Trojan athletes piled up an unofficial point score of 66½ in the university division and chalked up the two new records established during the afternoon.

Sagehens Cop

After a terrific struggle that wasn't decided until the last event, Pomona won the college-section competition with 48½ digits, nosing out Occidental, which registered 46½, and Caltech, which garnered 42½.

Los Angeles City College tallied 28 points to top the junior colleges.

Competing unattached because he is temporarily ineligible, burly Earl Audet pushed the pellet out 51ft. 8¾in. for the best individual mark even if it was merely an exhibition. The ex-Georgetown star now at S.C. made it on his first toss and had three other puts over the 50-foot line.

Actual winner of the shot-put was red-thatched Trojan Ron Thomas, who bettered the existing meet record with a heave of 49ft. 10in. Jack Raitt of Redlands held the old standard at 49ft. 1½in.

Tally Pushed

Lanky Searles Talley was pushed into the high-jump record of 6ft. 5¾in. by S.C. Teammate Dick Homeyer and Jim Hopkins of City College. The latter pair tied for second at 6ft. 4in. Talley's leap exceeded the mark set by Cornelius Johnson, 1936 Olympic Games champion, when the latter was attending Compton J.C. in 1934.

record was in the broad jump, where Stanford's Allan Hoisch long-hopped 23ft. 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ in., as against the existing mark of 23ft. 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ in.

Hoisch, a Los Angeles High grad, also figured in a close 100-yard dash in which he wound up third and also performed creditably on the Indian four-man 880-yard relay which was won by S.C.

Clifford Bourland, S.C.'s stand-out on the cinders, was clocked in 47.4s. for his anchor lap of the victorious Trojan four-man-mile quartet. He also brought home the Troy 880-yard foursome in front.

Other noteworthy performances were turned in by Ray Maggard of U.C.L.A. and Dick Vanderhoof, Pomona freshman, who tied for first in the pole vault at 13ft.
