Bourland Equals 300 Record as Troy Romps

S.C. Flash Runs Distance in 30.2s. to Tie Paddock's Mark Before 3000 Coliseum Fans

Sull a good month away from top form, Cliff Bourland equaled Charley Paddock's 22-year-old world record of 30.2s, for 300 yards at the Collseum yesterday in pacing the S.C. tracketers to an easy triumph over the Southern California College All-Stars, U.C.L.A. and a group of independents.

Making their season debut before some 3000 home folks, the Trojans amassed 60 5/6 points, the All-Stars tallied 40 1/3, the Bruins made 34 and the Independents garnered 19 5/6.

Eight-Yard Margin

Off his marks like a flash, the defending national quarter-mile champion spea away to a threeyard lead over Galen Fisher, Pomona's gallant challenger, at the century mark and pulled away steadily to hit the tape with eight yards to spare.

Bourland came back later and romped to victory in the 220, churning off the distance in 216s. He and Fisher battled about on even terms on the anchor lap of the mile relay. Bourland got the baton with approximately a fiveyard lead and wound up about the same, although Fisher pulled abreast midway through the tace.

Only other record performance of the day was the 13ft, 5in, pole vault by Dick Vanderhoof, Pomona College freshman up from South Pasadena High. The leap bettered his own mark of 13 feet set two weeks ago

Good Shot Mark

There were several other credible marks, too. Earl Audet, S.C. ineligible transfer from Georgetown got off his best put of the season when he pushed the pellet out 52ft, 9in.

Harrison Packard. Pepperdine's sturdy middle distance ace, ran away from Paul Jacano, S.C., in the stretch to annex the 880 in 1m. 56.6s. Craig Tyler of U.C.L.A. surprised Teammate Ken Boyd for third.
