

Three Records Set as Troy Nabs Spike Crown

Three meet records went by the boards at the Coliseum yesterday as the Trojans of S.C. rolled up their expected easy victory in the revived California intercollegiate track and field finals.

The Troy thinclads registered 76 points while the California Bears came through with a one-two in the closing event, the discus throw, to overtake U.C.L.A. for second, 45-42.

In the Bruin-S.C. dual meet, the Troys triumphed, 89-42.

Audet Sets Mark

Earl Audet, rotund Troy veteran, opened festivities by smashing the shot-put mark with a 51ft. 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. heave on his first toss. The old standard was held by Stanford's Jim Reynolds at 51ft. 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ in., set in 1935.

Dynamic little Roland Sink, also of S.C., kept up the fast pace by eclipsing the mile mark in the first running event of the day. The durable freshman ambled the four laps in 4m. 17.7s., as compared with the meet record of 4m. 19.9s., established by Cliff Halstead, S.C., back in '32. He also bettered the former S.C. yearling mark of 4m. 18.3s., set up by the great Louis Zamperini in 1937.

The third standard to totter was the high jump, in which Les Howe, California, transplanted Missouri leaper, soared over the bar at 6ft. 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. The former best, 6ft. 4 $\frac{1}{4}$ in., was made by Duncan McNaughton, S.C., in 1932.

Lawrence Disqualified

The Trojans' other star freshman, Al Lawrence, scored an even dozen points and would have made it 17 but for an accident on the last flight of low hurdles. Holding a slight lead, Lawrence missed his step and, being in the outside lane, ran around it. That, of course, disqualified him.

Previously, he had annexed the blue ribbon in the high hurdles in 14.8s.; tied for first in the pole vault with Martin Anderson of the Bears at 13ft., and placed second in the broad jump with a hop of 22ft. 11 $\frac{1}{4}$ in.

Sink came back to take the two-mile in 9m. 59s., making him a double winner along with Teammates Paul Iacono and Edsel Curry. The former won the

440 by six yards in 49.4s. and edged out Bruin Mode Perry in a 2m. 1.6s. 880. In the latter race Iacono used his head as much as his legs to win. He took over the lead and promptly slowed the pace down to a walk, completing the first lap in 62.5s. That left him enough kick to outgun Perry, primarily a miler who had stayed out of his specialty, in the stretch. Both have bettered 1m. 57s.

Bear Roger Harding spun the platter 140ft. 6in., the best of his career, and Teammate Russ Tauscheck did 138ft. 7in. to give the visitors those precious eight points that enabled them to nip the Westwooders.

Curry Surprises

Besides nabbing his pet event, the broad jump, at 23ft. 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ in., Curry came through with a surprise triumph in the 100 over Bruin Tom Carr and also contributed a fourth in the furlong. The century clocking was 10.1s.
