The Jaysees had their few moments, too. Jack Kaiser, Fullerton's versatile star, tallied 13¼ points in the four events he entered. He won the pole vault at 12ft, 6in.; tied for first in the high jump at 5tt, 10in.; placed second in the high hurdles and was second in the javelin at 17ift, 11% in.

Little Art. Nash, Los Angeles City College distance ace, was the official winner of the mile in 4m. 28.3s. although Carmen Bova, unattached, toured the distance in 4m. 23s. Thirty minutes later the Cub Bible student came back to cop the 880, two feet over Field Berry of S.C. The time was 1m. 59.5s.

Five of the events were actually captured by unattached athletes. Harrison Packard, Pepperdine flash representing the S.C.A.A, galloped off with the 440 in 49.8s., while the legal victor was Ed Grosse, the S.C. freshman, in 50.2s.
