

TROY TRACK SQUAD BESTS ALL-STARS

Doug Miller Hurls Javelin 194 Feet to Highlight Meet; Kaiser Places in Four Events

Just for the record, let us report that the University of Southern California trackmen scored a 76 $\frac{3}{4}$ -52 $\frac{1}{4}$ victory over the Southern California/All-Stars yesterday at the Coliseum. But the count was purely incidental and there were few highlights.

From an S.C. standpoint, Doug Miller's feat of hurling the javelin 194ft. 8 $\frac{1}{4}$ in., the best of his career as well as tops for the Coast this year, was the bright spot of the afternoon.

Kaiser Jaysee Star

The Jaysees had their few moments, too. Jack Kaiser, Fullerton's versatile star, tallied 13 $\frac{1}{4}$ points in the four events he entered. He won the pole vault at 12ft. 6in.; tied for first in the high jump at 5ft. 10in.; placed second in the high hurdles and was second in the javelin at 171ft. 11 $\frac{1}{4}$ in.

Little Art Nash, Los Angeles City College distance ace, was the official winner of the mile in 4m. 28.3s. although Carmen Bova, unattached, toured the distance in 4m. 23s. Thirty minutes later the Cub Bible student came back to cop the 880, two feet over Field Berry of S.C. The time was 1m. 59.5s.

Audet Shot Winner

Five of the events were actually captured by unattached athletes. Harrison Packard, Pepperdine flash representing the S.C.A.A., galloped off with the 440 in 49.8s., while the legal victor was Ed Grosse, the S.C. freshman, in 50.2s.

Johnny Blewener, ex-Trojan, skipped over the high hurdles

in his S.C.A.A. scanties to edge out George Kryder, another Trojan freshman, and Kaiser. The time was 15.2s.

Burly Earl Audet, Trojan ineligible, got back in the groove and pushed the shot out 52ft. 7½in. to easily best Corp. Woodrow Strode, ex-U.C.L.A. great, now of March Field. Strode did 46ft. 7in. and then won the discus with a spin of 140ft. 2in.

Both sprints were taken by Jack Trout, who showed a few signs of returning to form although the times were slow, 10.1s. and 22.2s. Frank Batiste, brother of famed Joe and now at March Field, was a close second in both cases.
