

Missourians Dominate Coliseum Track Meet

Big Six Athletes Take 880-Yard Relay and Maurice Alexander Captures Hurdle Race

Four versatile young men from the University of Missouri dominated yesterday's invitational track and field championships at the Coliseum.

More than 7500 fans watched: Capt. Joe Shy win the 100-yard dash in 9.7s., with Team-mates John Tracy and Owen Joggerst third and fourth.

Maurice Alexander capture both the high and low hurdles in 14.7s. and 23.5s.

The four of them combine to trounce Southern California by 10 yards in the 880-yard relay.

The same quartet blow the 440-yard relay when Alexander, running the first leg, dropped the baton after a few strides, thereby losing so much ground that it was a cakewalk for the Trojans.

Shy Beats Trout

Coach C. G. Simpson's lads added a lot of sparkle to a fine meet. Shy nosed out Jack Trout of S.C. in the century and Alexander was a convincing winner of the two hurdle races.

Al Lawrence, Glendale High School's 17-year-old phenom, ran second in both timber-topping events, a mighty fine showing by the powerful youngster.

John Biewener, former Trojan, was leading in the tall sticks when he hit the next to last hurdle and spilled on the track. It is doubtful if Alexander would have won but for Biewener's mishap.

Hollow Victory

Joe Barry, Capt. Cliff Bourland, Howard Callanan and Trout were easy winners of the 440-yard relay when Alexander's unfortunate act made it no contest. The time was 43s. flat as

the Trojans merely coasted home.

It was totally different in the half-mile relay, however, as the "Show Me" boys built up an early lead and went on to win by 10 yards in 1m. 26.7s. The same four Trojans ran second with Glendale High third.

Earl Audet, ineligible Trojan shot putter, shoved the iron ball 54ft. 9 $\frac{5}{8}$ in. to break his own S.P.A.A.U. record of 53ft. 3in. set last year. It was the finest effort of Audet's career.

Sink Wins Mile

Roland Sink, sensational South Pasadena High School miler who has been flirting with Louie Zamperini's national record of 4m. 21.3s., won the open mile in 4m. 26.9s. He ran his first lap too slow and never was able to make up that loss, being timed

in 66s. for the opening 440. The kid is a great runner.

Pat Turner, former Bruin, captured the broad jump with a splendid leap of 24ft. 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ in.

Harrison Packard, Pepperdine's middle-distance star, copped the 880 in 1m. 54.5s., taking the measure of Craig Tyler (U.C.L.A.) and Warren Smith of S.C.
