

# Trojans Qualify Six for N.C.A.A.

## Bourland, Trout Top Qualifiers as Violet Team Leads in Meet

EVANSTON (Ill.) June 11. (AP)—New York University led the national collegiate field today in qualifying for tomorrow's finals of the 22nd annual N.C.A.A. track and field championships. The Violets placed seven men in the finals and in addition have an excellent half-miler and miler in Ray Zoellner, who was not called on to compete today.

Southern California's title-defending Trojans, not rated much of a chance to grab their ninth straight crown prior to today's action, came through strongly with six qualifiers while Washington had five and California, Ohio State and the U.S. Naval Academy four each.

### Win in Final Events

N.Y.U. spotted Leonard Bates in the discus and Warren Halliburton in the low hurdles in the day's final two qualifying events at Northwestern University's Dyche Stadium to augment five who had placed earlier.

Winners for eight consecutive years, the Trojans qualified Cliff Bourland, defending quarter-mile champion, in both the 440 and 220 dashes; Jack Trout in the 100 and 220 dashes, Douglas Miller in the javelin and Edsel Curry in the broad jump for tomorrow's final events.

### Conwell Wins Dashes

New York University's seven-man squad, one of the premeet favorites to oust Southern California from its iron-grip hold on the meet, had five qualifiers at the four-fifths mark of today's preliminaries, with Edward Conwell in the 100 and 220 dashes, Frank Cotter and Charles Grohsberger in the 440 and Bernard Mayer in the shot put.

Qualifying action in the half mile was held up because of too few entries and all 11 contestants will run in tomorrow's finals.
