The feature mile run failed to produce a national interscholastic record but dynamic little Roland Sink came within a second and a half of the standard when he won the event in 4m. 22.8s. Murray Collins, Lincoln High of San Jose ace, was outsprinted for the runner-up spot by Jim Moreno of Garfield, 1942 city high school champ.

The race could easily have been a record breaking one but for jostling for position during the first two and a half laps. All three led the pack at several posts and it wasn't until the last 220 that Sink poured on the juice and pulled away. He hit the tape 20 yards ahead of Mo-reno, who in turn was 5 in front of Collins.

The fraction times were 64s. for the 440, a bit on the slow side; 2m. 12s. for the 880, 3m. 21s. for the 1320 yards. That meant sink rattled off the last lap in 61.8s., and he had plenty left at the finish. Lawrence Beaten

Al Lawrence, the Glendale High sensation, met defeat for the first time this season when Don Hunt, city champion from Manual Arts, took his measure by two feet in the high hurdles. The time was 15.2s

Lawrence came back to beat Leroy Gay of Jefferson in the 220-yard low hurdles around a curve in 24.2s. and leap 23ft. 3in. on his last attempt to cop the broad jump from Ralph Cramer of Redlands. That netted him a total of 13 points and the prep high point man trophy.

Jack Trout of S.C. annexed both sprints, although his century time, 9.9s. was inferior to
