

Sink Misses Mile Mark in Pasadena Spikefest

South Pasadena Ace Runs Four Laps in 4m. 22.8s. as Meet Records Shattered

The old song of the broken record hummed out with monotonous regularity yesterday as some 200 Southland cinder stars shattered virtually every record

on the second annual Pasadena track and field games program at Pasadena Junior College.

All told, 22 of the marks established in the opening meet last year were bettered, leaving just two standing and one equaled.

Miss Mile Mark

The feature mile run failed to produce a national interscholastic record but dynamic little Roland Sink came within a second and a half of the standard when he won the event in 4m. 22.8s. Murray Collins, Lincoln High of San Jose ace, was outsprinted for the runner-up spot by Jim Moreno of Garfield, 1942 city high school champ.

The race could easily have been a record breaking one but for jostling for position during the first two and a half laps. All three led the pack at several posts and it wasn't until the last 220 that Sink poured on the juice and pulled away. He hit the tape 20 yards ahead of Moreno, who in turn was 5 in front of Collins.

The fraction times were 64s. for the 440, a bit on the slow side; 2m. 12s. for the 880, 3m. 21s. for the 1320 yards. That meant Sink rattled off the last lap in 61.8s., and he had plenty left at the finish.

Lawrence Beaten

Al Lawrence, the Glendale High sensation, met defeat for the first time this season when Don Hunt, city champion from Manual Arts, took his measure by two feet in the high hurdles. The time was 15.2s.

Lawrence came back to beat Leroy Gay of Jefferson in the 220-yard low hurdles around a curve in 24.2s. and leap 23ft. 3in. on his last attempt to cop the broad jump from Ralph Cramer of Redlands. That netted him a total of 13 points and the prep high point man trophy.

Jack Trout of S.C. annexed both sprints, although his century time, 9.9s. was inferior to

that of Mel Patton, high school division victor, who ran 9.8s. Both annexed their 220 events in 21.9s.

Bourland Competes

Cliff Bourland, Trojan captain who has been ailing, participated in four events but didn't try too hard in any. He went unplaced in the 100, finished second in the 220, won the 440 in 49.5s, from James Wilson, Belmont's, city champ, and ran a lap on the Troy relay team.

Veteran Bobby Madrid, a former Pasadena Jaycee lad who matriculated at Fresno State and is now at Lemoore Flying School, ran off with the two-mile in 9m, 50.6s., beating his closest rival by some 200 yards.

John Biewener, former S.C. star, won the high hurdles in 14.9s, while Bill Dillon, ex-Narbonne flash who went to Notre Dame, nabbed the low timber in 24.6s.

Good Marks

Field event marks were very good. Willie Dancer high-jumped 6ft. 3in., Pat Turner broad-jumped 23ft. 10in., Earl Audet put the shot 52ft. 8½in., Fred Winter vaulted 13ft., Doug Miller, S.C., tossed the javelin 190ft. and Jerry Shipkey of Anaheim won the prep shotput at 57ft. 10¼in.

Jack Kaiser of Fullerton J.C. scored 10½ points to win the open division high point man trophy. He was third in the high hurdles, third in broad jump, third in javelin, third in discus and tied for second in pole vault.
