

Caltech Nabs Honors in College Relays

Braving a near-gale and threatening rain, the traditional Southern California College Relays were run off at Occidental yesterday and, although nary a meet record was established, the presence of S.C., U.C.L.A. and several unattached athletes made it quite an interesting affair.

Caltech's well-rounded squad, bulging with Navy V-12 students, dominated the college division with 56 points, while Compton—the only junior college team entered—naturally won the two-year school title with 33½ markers. Trailing Caltech were Occidental, 26¼, and Redlands, 18.

Vault Mark Neared

Nearest anyone came to breaking a mark was Occidental's Dick Vanderhoof, who cleared 13ft. 2in. in the pole vault, just two inches off the record. The ex-Pomona star likely would have set a standard but for the stiff wind.

Coach Dean Cromwell was invited to enter all his Trojan field event men and two relays—on a nonscoring basis. In the four-man 880-yard event the S.C. sprinting combine of Skiles Hoffman, Paul Iacono, Joe Barry and Eddie Grosse shaded U.C.L.A. The time was 1m. 30.1s.

The other Troy baton-passing team ran second to Caltech after giving the Engineers a 30-second handicap. Roland Sink, who spent three days in bed with the measles last week, anchored the squad with a 4m. 32.1s. mile. Caltech, with George Gil running last, was clocked in 11m. 5.7s., while the Trojans' time was 10m. 44.6s.

Pacing the Caltech point parade was Weight Man Don Tillman, who captured the shot put

at 44ft. 6in. and discus with a heave of 123ft. 8in. Invitational leaders in these events were Jerry Shipkey of U.C.L.A., 48ft. 3½in. in the shot. (S.C.'s Earl Audet failed to show up) and Bill Dalton, unattached, 125ft. in the discus.

Busiest man on the field was Jack Kaiser, the former Fullerton Jaysee ironman now of the San Diego Marines. Kaiser participated in all six field events and placed in five. He won the javelin at 163ft. 7in.; tied for first in the high jump at 6ft. 2in.; placed second in the pole vault with a leap of 13ft.; garnered fourths in the shot put (42ft. 1½in.), and discus (119ft. 5in.)
