

# Audet Shatters Shot-Tossing Trojan Record

Mammoth Earl Audet, Trojan weight man, shoved the shot 54ft. 4½in. yesterday to hang up the outstanding performance in the invitational feature of the big prep carnival at the Coliseum.

Although not the best of his career, Earl's effort went into the books as a new Trojan record. He held the old mark of 53ft. 4in., made a week ago at Fresno, and had done 51ft. 9½in. last season, but was not wearing an S.C. uniform at the time.

Johnny Fulton, former L.A. High and Stanford boy now running for the Olympic Club, trimmed Paul Iacono of S.C. in the feature 600-yard race.

## Sink's Bid Falls

Bent on shattering Ben Eastman's American record of 1m. 9.2s., Fulton had to be content with 1m. 11.7s. He beat Iacono by two yards, with Warren Smith third.

Roland Sink's bid for a 4m. 15s. mile failed through lack of competition. The little Trojan freshman won by 50 yards over Tom Quinn, formerly of Michigan State, in 4m. 18.4s.

Pat Turner, who used to jump for the Bruins and now sports the colors of the Olympic Club, got off one of the best broad jumps registered in the United States this season when he leaped 24ft. 2in.

Elroy Hirsch of Michigan did one-fourth of an inch better two weeks ago.

## Kaiser Twin Victor

Jack Kaiser of the San Diego Marines won both the high jump and high hurdles, the latter when Al Lawrence, the favorite, hit three barriers and was forced into third spot. Kaiser was a great all-around performer at Fullerton Jaycee before entering the service.

Tommy Carter of Caltech finished with a burst of speed to tie Edsel Curry of Troy for first in the Charles W. Paddock Memorial 100 meters. The time was 11.1s.

The Trojans tallied a total of 34½ points in an unofficial tabulation, with the Olympic Club second at 13 and the San Diego Marines third with 11½.
