

Trojans Impress With 84-44 Win Over Oxy

Those slightly sensational S.C. Trojans, who are fairly itching to rack up their 10th consecutive national collegiate track title, had a hilarious time at their coming-out party yesterday as they waltzed to an 84 2/5 to 44 3/5 victory over Occidental in their traditional handicap meet at Patterson Field.

Seven Trojan scratchmen overcame substantial give-aways and still nabbed firsts — with some remarkable marks. As a matter of fact, Bengal entries took only three clear firsts, as other Troys rose up to nail down other five blue ribbons.

meet mark when he stepped a phenomenal 4m. 15s. mile. The old mark, which he set in 1944, was 4m. 22.6s. Giving away as much as 35 seconds, he ran the first lap in 61s., the 880 in 2m. 7s., 1320 in 3m. 13s. and the anchor oval in 62s. to win by some 25 yards.

Other Dean Cromwell charges who impressed in their debut were Bob Hart, who pole vaulted 13ft. 9in.; Mel Patton, who was clocked in 9.7s. for the century with a two-foot handicap; Bill Wakefield and Tom Follis, who high leaped 6ft. 4in. from scratch; Jim Slosson, victor in the 440 at 49.7s., and Wilbur Thompson, who put the shot 49ft. 9 3/4 in. although it doesn't show in the summary—he had too much distance to overcome.

High point men for the day were Tiger Jack Price, who annexed both hurdles, the highs in 15.7s. and the lows in 24.7s, and Trojan Sylvester Heinberg, shot winner at 51ft. 4in. with an 8ft. 6in. bulge and discus kingpin at 138ft. 7in. with a 2ft. aid.

Lawrence Falls

Lone disappointment in the meet, from a Trojan standpoint, was Al Lawrence, who fell while leading the high hurdles and had to be scratched from two other events in which he was favored, the low barriers and broad jump.
