

# Trojans Capture Track Meet as Marks Topple

Fifteen meet records were equaled or shattered last night as the standout collegiate and high school athletes in the Southland wound up the two-day Pasadena Games in the Rose Bowl before some 7500 fans.

Coach Dean Cromwell's S.C. Trojans were even hotter than expected and easily won the open division title with 62 points, while the Jefferson High Lettermen's Club annexed the prep division honors with 42 markers.

Features of the evening were Trojan Al Lawrence's duels with Craig Dixon of U.C.L.A. in the hurdles, with the S.C. ace avenging last week's high stick loss in 14.6s., and also taking the 220-yard lows around the curve in 23.7s.

The first mark was a new standard and the latter tied the meet record. In the highs the pair skimmed the last barrier as one but Lawrence forged two feet ahead at the tape. There were four yards between them in the lows.

## Other Records Fall

The other open division records shattered were: 440, Roy Cochran, L.A.A.C., 49.4s.; 880, John Fulton, Olympic Club, 1m. 52.4s.—around five curves; mile relay, S.C.'s quartet of Bruce Miller, Tom Tackett, John Wachtler and Wells DeLoach, 3m. 20s.; shotput, Wilbur Thompson, S.C., 53ft. 2 1/2 in.; javelin, Bob Peoples of the L.A.A.C., 202ft. 3 1/2 in.; pole vault, Tex Winter, S.C., 14ft. 1/2 in.; broad jump, Willie Steele, San Diego State, 24ft. 1/2 in., and discus, Emerson Hiler, L.A.A.C., 154ft. 1 1/2 in.

The fine performances also prevailed in the prep set with four marks falling and another equaled. John Helwig of Mt. Carmel, who last week set a national interscholastic record of 59ft. 5 1/2 in., did 58ft. 5 1/2 in. for a new meet record.

## Sink Misses Meet

Others were high jump, Wilfred Schlange of Citrus, 6ft. 2 1/2 in.; 880, Price Cobbs of Jefferson Lettermen's Club, 2m. flat; high hurdles, Hugh McElhenny, Washington, 14.9s., and 440, Perry Taylor, San Diego, 31.3s., tying the record.

A sidelight was the nonappearance of Roland Sink, the Trojans' distance ace. Though he has been nursing a lame leg, Cromwell urged Sink to enter the mile but he refused to risk suffering his first defeat when he heard Fulton would run the race also.

In running third to Fulton in the 880, Ralph Gold of U.C.L.A. set a school record of 1m. 55.7s.
