

Trojans Rout Indians, 108-23

Coach Dean Cromwell's steadily improving S.C. Trojans ran up their most lopsided dual meet track victory over Stanford University yesterday when they buried the Hatchetmen under a 108-23 score before 3500 fans at the Coliseum.

Five Troys, paced by Roland Sink's record-smashing two-mile run, turned in their best performances of the season as the outclassed Indians salvaged but two first places and two seconds.

Sink sauntered off with the only meet mark, a 9m. 22.4s. eight-lapper, as against the late standard, 9m. 39.4s., set by Marston Girard of Stanford in 1939 and equaled by S.C.'s Leroy Weed in 1942. Striding easily ahead of his planned 9m. 30s. pace, Sink lapped the entire field 220 yards from the tape and was so strong that he finished another 50 yards ahead. He ran the first mile in 4m. 41s.

Jumping Al Lawrence lowered his hurdle clockings to 14.7s. and 23.7s. and became a breezing triple winner when his lone broad jump of 24ft. 1in. was not approached.

Two Stanford Wins

Other Trojans showing improvement were Tex Winter, who lofted himself over the pole vault bar at 13ft. 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ in.; Bill Wakefield, who high-leaped 6ft. 5in., and Wilbur (Moose) Thompson, who shoved the shot out 52ft. 9in.

The latter also nabbed the discus at 147ft. 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. Mel Patton, protecting an injured muscle, was clocked in 9.9s. and 21.9s. in annexing the 100 and 220.

Stanford's triumphs came in the mile, with Frank Ganahl outkicking Trojan Wally Wilson in 4m. 30.4s., and when Bob Kenwood took the javelin throw with a fling of 176ft. 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. Tribe seconds occurred in the 880, which saw Trojan Jim Slosson take a

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yard win over Indian George Grimes, and in the pole vault, in which Bill Larson and Martin Anderson tied at 12ft. 8in. behind Winter, S.C.'s lone entry.
