

Troy Captures Modesto Meet

MODESTO, June 8. (AP)—Southern California's Trojans, comprising the strongest track and field aggregation on the West Coast again this year, won the fifth annual California relays here tonight with a score of 62 1/5.

Dean Cromwell's favored squad easily met and over-matched the challenge hurled by the San Francisco Olympic Club loaded with ex-college stars but only able to total 56 1/5 tallies.

Lagging far back were these others in the open intercollegiate division; University of California at Los Angeles, 16; Los Angeles Athletic Club, 15; California, 14; San Jose, 4; College of the Pacific, 3 3/5; Alameda Naval Air Station, 3; Glendale, 2; Alameda High School, 2; Fresno State, 1.

Times and distances were not spectacular, although a few relays records were bettered before a crowd of some 3500 fans.

One of the good individual performances saw Hank Gabriel, Glendale Junior College hurdler, place third in the open competition and come back in a few minutes to win the junior college event in 15.1s for the 120-yard high barriers. The open division, incidentally, went to Craig Dixon, U.C.L.A., in 14.6s.

Modesto won the junior college team championship with 46 points with Sacramento College in second place with 32. San Francisco Junior College, prerelays favorite, took third with 31. Other tallies were distributed as follows:

Santa Monica 19, Salinas 17, Visalia 17, Glendale 9.

Modesto also won the high school team title with 38 1/2
