**LASH THIRD.**

Don Lash, a constant headline attraction in track circles 10 years ago, was third in the 25-lap 10,000-meter event. Now an FBI agent at Lafayette, Ind., Lash took a back seat to Eddie O'Toole of the New York Athletic club, who easily defended his crown.

Wayne's Lorenzo Wright was the busiest trackster on the field with a first and two seconds. He won the broad jump with a leap of 24 feet 3/4 inches.

Missouri's Mel Sheehan finished third in the discus. Jack Dinnell of Chadron was fifth and Richard Shipman, Doane college, was awarded sixth in the javelin event.

Lawler's galloping helped his San Antonio Athletic club males grab the team title with 70 points. The Los Angeles Athletic club was second with 59 1/2 with the Fourth Army Air force third with 36.

Today the meet winds into the senior competition with such track names competing as Les Steers, Herb McKenley, Charley Parker, Willie Steele, Harrison Dillard and Les MacMitchell.
