

# Dashman Does 9.5s. 100 in Trojan Win

RIVERSIDE, April 5.—Mel Patton, S.C.'s latest sprint sensation, flashed over the 220-yard distance in 20.4s., just one-tenth of a second off Jesse Owens' world record, here today as the powerful Trojan trackmen routed Riverside Junior College, 100% to 26%, in a handicap meet.

Aided slightly by a mild breeze, the long-striding sophomore was caught in 20.4s. by two of the five watches, two had splits between 20.4s. and 20.5s. and the fifth showed 20.5s. He also ran the 100 in 9.5s., one-tenth of a second slower than the world standard of 9.4s.

Patton ran the dashes in 9.5s. and 20.7s. last week, setting a University record in the latter event.

## Big Margins

In the 100 Patton won by 4½ yards over Riverside's Art Williams, who has been clocked in 9.8s. this season, and defeated the 1946 prep State champ by 12 yards in the furlong.

The meet marked the season's debut of Al Lawrence, who has been having scholastic difficulties. The classy hurdler didn't run the high hurdles as he was the only entry who showed up but he breezed over the low barriers in 23.5s. and took only one leap to win the broad jump at 22ft. 2¾ in.

## Speedy Quarter

Besides Patton's flashy clockings, Bob Chambers' 48.2s. 440 was the best of the day. After running flashy half miles in previous meets the rangy freshman stepped down to edge out Teammate Wells DeLoach by two

yards. It was a new S.C. freshman record.

Also gladdening Coach Dean Cromwell's heart were the antics of Doug Miller, who took the javelin with a toss of 183ft. 8in. and, in his first attempt of the year, spun the discus 139ft. 9½in.
