Trojan Star Suffers First Loss of Season; Fitch Tops World Mark

Pell Mel Pation, the S.C. flyer, went down to his first defeat of the season last night when Lloyd La Beach, who intends to enroll at U.C.L.A. next semester, took his measure in the 220-yard dash of the Southern Pacific A.A.U, Pasadena games meet at the Collseum last night before some 10.000 fans.

The star-studied meet saw records set in 11 of the 16 open events and in three of the Class A high school events. Coach Dean Cromwell's Trojans were easy winners of the team title with 48½ points while the San Francisco Olympic Club scored 24 for second as the Los Angeles A.C. and UCLA tied for third with 23½.

With most of the prepsters competing unattached, the Watts A.C. won the team scoring at 20. Washington High Athletes were second with 14, followed by Long Beach Boosters, 11, and San Diego Boys Club, 9. La Beach, a lanky Jamaican

La Beach, a lanky Jamaican who formerly attended Wisconsin University, was a wire-towire winner, hitting the tape a full three yards to the good. The time for 220 yards was 20.8s., for 200 meters 20.7s.

The setback broke Patton's string of 18 straight victories this season.

Crowd Loud

The highly enthusiastic crowd had previously witnessed one Coliseum record broken and andifter equaled. Bob Fitch, who has an application for a world discus record of 180ft. 2% in, spun the disc 177ft. 9% in. to cellpse the stadium standard of 172ft. 11% in. set by Archie Harris of Indiana in 1943. The present accepted world record is 174ft. 10% in.

A mild surprise occurred when Craig Dixon, rangy U.C.L.A. star, ran away from the field and took the 120-yard high hurdles in 14s. flat. That tied the Coliseum record set by Bob Wright of Ohio State in 1941.

Smith Wins

Guinn Smith of the Olympic Club cleared 14ft. 3in. to cop the pole vault and Earle Meadows, competing unattached, and Ray Kring, College of Pacific, got over 14 feet to tie for second.

Bucking a 5.6 miles per hour wind, Patton had to go all out to hold La Beach in the 100-meter dash. Pell Mell got off to one of his best starts and glided to a fivefoot lead at the 60-yard mark.
