Ashcraft rang up five points for the Trobabes with an easy win in the shot put. His winning distance was 44ft. 11/2 in.

SC's Brown was surprise winner of the broad jump with a leap of 21ft. 41/2 in. The event had been expected to go to Nicholson.

Showing promise of better things to come, John Rowan went over 12ft. 6in. in the pole vault to score another victory for the yearlings. Barnes deadlocked with Turner of Fullerton in the high jump ot & feet even.

With the four-man relay the only race left on the card, the two outfits were tied up at 34-all. All seven points awarded in a four-man relay event in a dual meet go to the winning team, which set the stage for the speedy quartet of Burdette MJsier, Bob King, Rube Wolf, and Don Hughes to ice the contest for Troy by breezing to an easy triumph by 10 yards in the time of 4:43.6.

The winners picked up six first places in nine events, but still had difficulty prevailing because of the slightly superior depth of the Hornet squad. Other Trojan firsts were chaulked up by the medley relay trip trio of Wolf, Harry Messenheimer, and Hughes; and by Harry Parry in the diving, Wolf in the

150-yard backstroke. Ace Burns in the 50-yard freestyle, and Hughes in the 100-yard rfeestyle.

Ed Illsley, Fullerton distance star, was the only double winner of the evening in the one-man events, edging Trojan Bob King in the 220yard freestyle and then coming back to take the 440 free.
