

TROY SPIKEMEN POWER OVER TIGERS, 111-24

Reversing their custom of recent years, Coach Dean Cromwell's SC spike brigade launched its season in low gear yesterday at Patterson Field. Even at that they carried too much power for Coach Payton Jordan's Occidental crew and ran up a 111 $\frac{1}{2}$ -to-24 $\frac{1}{2}$ victory in their annual dual meet, winning all but two events.

Although Cromwell figured several of his athletes would turn in better efforts, he wasn't disappointed. It's going to be an awfully long season, and the big pot is at the other end.

Only in three events could SC's marks be considered better than mediocre. Best was the 13ft. 6in. leap by John Montgomery in winning the pole vault. He just did miss 14ft., as did Bob Hart, who will become eligible in a few weeks.

Next in line was the shot-putting of Bill Bayless and Henry

Springer. Bayless pitched the pellet 50ft. 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. to miss the meet record by five inches and Springer got a heave out 49ft. 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ in.

A pleasant surprise was the high hurdling of Ed Schnell and Don Halderman. The two former junior college stars finished inches apart in 15s. flat, Schnell getting the nod.

Wells DeLoach, who was reportedly set to break the 440 meet standard of 49s., was forced to go all out to nip Bob Inman, Tiger newcomer, in 51.6s. He came back later with a strong finish to annex the furlong at 22.5s. and become the day's only double winner.
