SANTA BARBARA, March 27. The Los Angeles Athletic Club gang of "old men," showing shocking speed in the short events, won the eighth renewal of the Santa Barbara Relays here

tonight with 65 points. They edged out Dean Cromwell's SC Trojans, who totaled 57½ points. UCLA, the defending champion, was third with 291/2. The closing mile relay decided the issue. After scoring 6½ points in the pole vault to pull up to within four points of the lead, SC's quarter-milers were bested by the Mercury men by five yards in 3m, 20.7s

Roy Cochran received the baton on the last lap with two yards on Troy's Wells DeLoach, and, after the collegian had stayed with him for 400 yards, Cochran slowly but surely pulled away. Compton won out in the high school division by scoring 30 points to Long Beach Poly's 281/2.

Santa Barbara was third with 211/2 Lau Wen-ngau of Shanghai, China, lived up to his advance notices when he won the specela 10,000-meter run in the speedy time of 31m. 53s. He won by 600 yards over Merle Knox of San Jose State, who in turn ended the long grind 30 yards ahead the Lau's teammate, Wang Chan-ling.

Coming into the final lap Fulton put on a terrific spurt to take over the lead on the rail. He held his advantage until the drive home when Chambers pulled up almost abreast but couldn't quite get up there to break the tape. Fletcher also figured in the blanket finish, coming up with Chambers and finishing just a yard behind.

#### Individual Times

Fulton was clocked in 1m. 55.6s., Chambers in 1m. 56s. flat and Fletcher in 1m. 55.9s. Other members of the club quartet were John Stewart, Field Berry and Wally Wilson.

The Mercury flashes copped another first when they took the four-man 440 in 42.3s., which lowered the mark Los Angeles City College set last year by exactly a second. Cliff (Happy) Bourland anchored the foursome, with Art Reinke. Don Lawrence and Al Lawrence running previous legs. The Trojans were second, four yards behind, and San Jose was third.

The high jump, shot-put and distance medley relay marks were tossed into discard within a space of 10 minutes. Barnes, 20-year-old SC freshman who was an all-city end at Dorsev High, wiggled over the bar at 6ft, 61/2 in, to better the oldest meet mark in the book, 6ft. 64 in, hung up by Henry Lassalette of the LAAC back in '32.

Big Jim Delaney of the San Francisco Olympic Club pitched

the shot 52ft. 4% in. against the previous best of 50ft. 51/4 in. Also bettering the former standard were the Trojans' Bill Bayless at 51ft. 91/2 in. and the LAAC's Wilbur Thompson, who did 51ft.

With Roland Sink on the anchor mile, the Troy team lowered the distance medley mark from 10m. 39.4s. to 10m. 34.3s.

### Bourland Second

The reincarnated Bourland kept the LAAC in the team title scramble when he ran second in the open century three yards behind Lloyd LaBeach, who was clocked in 9.6s, over the rather "dead" track. The Jamaican jiffy man, who recently turned in a 9.4s. race, didn't get his usual flying start, and that likely cost him a 10th of a second in the dash against the clock.

Bourland came back minutes later to close out the LAAC's winning effort in the 880 relay, which also went down as a new record. The combine of Reinke. Hubie Kerns, John Wachtler and Bourland toured the distance in 1m. 28.5s., the former best being 1m. 29.9s.

Craig Dixon of UCLA had to scamper to annex the open 120 high hurdles from the fast-conditioning Al Lawrence, LAAC, in 14.5s. Dixon won by five feet.
