

# Trojan Spikers Defeat Bears

BERKELEY, May 1—One meet record was broken (as were the hearts of 7000 Golden Bear fans) when Coach Dean Cromwell's University of Southern California tracksetrs came with a rush to top California's game spikesters, 73 to 68, on Edwards Field here today.

Little Roland Sink opened the meet with a blazing 4m. 13.2s. mile, the fastest of his career. His time for the four laps smashed Louis Zamperini's 10-year-old standard of 4m. 13.7s., set by the SC speedster in 1938.

Sink trailed California's Kaare Vefling for the first three and one-quarter laps but as they rounded the first turn of the final go-around Sink poured it on and won by 20 yards. His teammate, Carmen Bova, caught Vefling in the stretch to grab a surprise second place.

glued on an Olympic berth this summer, came through with his expected two victories. Mel, off to a bad start in the century after two false starts by nervous Bears, won by four yards in 9.6s. He was battling a 1.4-m.p.h. head wind.

The lithe ex-University High ace captured the furlong in 21s. by six yards to complete his usual double.

Cromwell was enthusiastic after the meet over the performance of big Al Wilson, who took a blue ribbon for the Trojans with a 152ft. 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. discus toss, his best ever.

## Chambers Impresses

Another individual mark was registered by Troy's Bob Chambers in the 880 when he toured the two laps in 1m. 53.7s. to win by 10 yards over Cal's Don Jackson. Chambers' previous best winning mark, 1m. 54.4s., was made, oddly enough, on the same track when he was galloping for Las Gatos High School.

With two events remaining, the low hurdles and the relay, SC held a 62-55 lead. SC's Ronnie Frazier clinched the meet when he overtook Bear Don Rademaker in the run for the tape. Rademaker cleared the last hurdle first but Frazier's stretch run gave him a 23.9s. triumph.
