

SC Tracksters Rout Tempe by 110-21 Margin

TEMPE, Ariz., March 19—Coach Jess Hill's SC tracksters took a liking to the warm weather this afternoon at Arizona State of Tempe's Goodwin Stadium and powered their way to a 110-21 triumph over Coach Donn Kinzle's outmanned Sun Devils.

The mighty Trojans, who are favored to take the NCAA this year, won all but one event and scored clean sweeps in six, to completely annihilate their hosts.

There were no really outstanding performances, but the 2200 partisan fans got their biggest thrill of the day when Arizona's Bill Miller, Negro javelin thrower, tossed the spear 205ft. 10in. to cop the blue ribbon, the only one of the afternoon for the locals.

Trojan Parade

Long John Montgomery, Troy's vaulting ace, made his 1949 outdoor debut and cleared 14 feet to win his specialty. John had a couple of narrow misses at 14ft. 3in.

Only double winner of the day was Trojan George Pasquali, transfer from Glendale College, who sprinted to victories in the 100 and 220-yard dashes. Pasquali took the century in 10s. flat and came back to win the furlong in 22.8s.

Ronnie Frazier, SC's sawed-off hurdler, gave evidence that he is reaching top condition by breezing to a 23.9s. in the 220-yard low barriers.

Burly Bob Chambers made his first effort in the mile a winning

one by coasting to first place in 4m. 27.8s. Chambers, who placed sixth in the Olympic 800 meters at London, wasn't pressed and appeared capable of breaking the 4m. 20s. mark.

Co-Capt. Bill Bayless showed signs of emerging from his shot-put slump by pushing the bulb 51ft. 7in. to gain top honors in that event.

Getting off the best leap of his career, Tom Patsalis led a Trojan sweep in the broad jump with a mark of 23ft. 8³/₁₆in.

Lanky Don Halderman equaled the best time of his life by clipping the 120-yard high hurdles in 14.8s. The Trojans scored one of their sweeps in this race with Art

Barnard and Ed Schnell chasing Halderman across the finish line.

Pell-Mel Patton was in suit but did not compete. Troy's world's fastest human gave the fans a thrill by warming up his million-dollar legs with a few wind sprints between events.

Wells DeLoach, SC's top quarter-miler, sat out the proceedings with a pulled muscle and Norm Stock took the quarter in 51s. as Wells shouted support.
