

# SC Seniors Win Only 3 Events; Bill Bayless Stars

Junior and sophomore power, valuable insurance for lasting success, paced Coach Jess Hill's SC track and field forces to a 102 3/4-33 3/4 victory over Occidental yesterday afternoon on the losers' field.

The Trojans won 12 of the 16 events and made complete grabs in five of 'em. SC seniors captured only three events and two were by big Bill Bayless, who took the shot-put at 50ft. 5 3/4in. and the discus with a twirl of 137ft. 5 3/4in.

## Troy Juniors Shine

The only other Trojan winner who won't be back was Dock Fordham, who stole broad jump honors at 22ft. 8 3/4in.

Trojan juniors ran off with five triumphs and the sophomores took the remaining four firsts. Most impressive mark made on the slightly slow cinders was the pole vault feats of John Rowan and Frank Johnson, a couple of Sophs who wiggled over 13ft. 6in. John Montgomery, Troy's hot shot bamboo artist, cleared 13ft. and called it a day due to a slight injury.

## Parker Wins 440

Occidental's fans—and there were plenty among the crowd of 3500—cheered loudest when blond Bill Parker poured it on in the stretch to defeat SC's Wells DeLoach by five yards in a 49.7s. 440. He led from gun to tape.

The Bengal rooters also cheered Ted Ruprecht, who earned the day's high point honors off a first in the 220, second in the 100 and relay laps in the victorious 440 and mile teams.

Jack Barnes, flaming redheaded sophomore, made his varsity debut with a 6ft. 3 3/4in. performance to annex the high jump. Other sophs nabbing blue ribbons were Bobby Mitchell, who outspurred teammate John Cherry to cop the two mile at 10m. 1.1s.; and George Pasquale, a narrow victor in the century at 10.1s. Francis Katchaturian, Oxy's chief sprint hope, was disqualified for jumping the gun twice.

## Pruitt Cops 880

Troy's triumphs by men with one more year of eligibility were Bob Pruitt, 880 in 1m. 59.7s.; Don Halderman, who nipped teammate Ed Schnell in a 15.1s. high hurdle race; Ron Fraser, a laughing winner of the low hurdles in 25s. flat; Wilfred Baile, a transfer from Santa Ana JC, who toured the mile in 4m. 30.8s.; and Dean Dillingham, transfer from Salinas JC, best in the javelin with a 177ft. 6in. toss.

Just in case these lads aren't up to tougher tasks ahead, the Trojans still have other stars who were inactive yesterday, among them Pell-Mel Patton, Al Lawrence, Bob Chambers, Wally Wilson, Tom Fells and Henry Aihara.
