old Trojan warhorse, but Coach Jess Hill and his SC track team had to apply the whip a bit to finish a few short lengths ahead of Compton College, 76-55, in their dual track meet yesterday before 3000 fans in Compton's Ramsaur Stadium. Five meet records were blasted

into oblivion during the summeryhot afternoon, but Coach Herschel Smith's crimson-shirted Tartars stole most of the thunder first places by collecting seven out of the 15 events.

And they did all this despite the fact that Compton's star, Bill Fell,

was out of action because of a case of the mumps and also without Billy Anderson's expected quadruple conquest.

Anderson did, however, turn in a creditable performance by grabbing wins in the 100 and high hurdles and seconds in the broad jump and low hurdles. There were a couple of good reasons why Anderson finished only runner-up in the latter two events. Frazier Flies

SC's Ronnie Frazier was the reason in the low hurdles. Frazier boosted Trojan morale considerably for next Saturday's Coliseum meet with Michigan State by flying over the low sticks in 23s. flat. He had a decisive edge at the halfway point and finished four yards in front. The old meet mark was

The reason Anderson did no better in the broad jump was because he crow-hopped on his first two leaps, both of which were bet-ter than 24 feet. On his third ter than 24 feet. On his third try he took off fully 18 inches be-hind the board and barely made the finals on his fourth and last qualifying jump. After his busy afternoon he could do no better than 23ft. 2%in. behind the record-breaking jump of 23ft. 6in. by SC's Henry Aihara.

Anderson won the 100 in 9.8s. and the high hurdles in 14.8s.
