SC Quartet Again Under Listed World Mark at Modesto

BY RUSS NEWLAND MODESTO, May 21 (P)-Southern California's great half-mile relay team, anchored by Sprint Champion Mel Patton, bettered the world's record tonight for the third time in eight days by winning the event in the California Relays.

The Trojan quartet of George Pasquali, Ronnie Frazier, Norm Stocks and the Peerless Patton ripped off the four furlongs in Im. 24.9s.

Last night, in the Los Angeles Coliseum Relays, the same four stopped the clock at Im. 24s, flat, and a week ago tonight, in the West Coast Relays at Fresno, they turned the distance in Im. 24.4s, Stanford's team of 1987 set the recognized record of Im. 25c,
