

Ken Carpenter, Draper Honored

Kenny Carpenter and the late Foy Draper, two of Troy's Olympic champions at Berlin in 1936, shared in university honors yesterday on the Trojan campus when President Fred D. Fagg Jr. presented plaques in dedication of the Olympic trees which these two athletes presented to the school after their triumphs in Berlin.

The dedication ceremonies were sponsored by the Trojan Track Alumni Association, with Mike Portonova, president, officiating.

Carpenter, who was present yesterday and is now coaching at Compton College, set a new record in winning the discus in the 1936 international classic. He still holds the Trojan record of 174ft. 1 13/64in.

Draper, who was killed in action during the war, ran third man on the victorious United States 400-meter relay team which still holds the world record of 39.8s.
