

Mattoon Wins Fourth Spot on SC Relay Team

Stan Mattoon won the fourth berth on SC's two-mile relay team with a 1m. 54.8s. triumph in a special 880 race yesterday in the Coliseum. Mattoon, former Fullerton JC star, joins Bob Pruitt, Bob Chambers and Wally Wilson on the Trojan quartet which will be out to crack the world's record of 7m. 34.5s. for the two-mile relay Saturday night in the West Coast Relays in Fresno.

Pruitt has a 1m. 52s. clocking this year, Wilson 1m. 53.3s., and Chambers 1m. 53.9s. Should the quartet perform at its best at Fresno, the SC team could turn the distance in 7m. 34s., or .5s. under the old mark.

Finishing behind Mattoon in the special 880 yesterday were Fred Wehking (1m. 55s.), Bobby Mitchell (1m. 55.6s.) and Jim (Chief) Newcomb (1m. 55.7s.)

Scott Makes It

Hurdler Joe Scott ripped off a 10s. flat 100 triumph over Art Barnard and Ronnie Frazier to win the fourth spot on the 440 relay team. Johnny Bradley, Al Mejia and George Pasquali are the remaining sprint relay men.

Norm Stocks turned in a 21.8s. 220 to grab the last spot on the 880-yard relay team. He defeated Frazier and Barnard.

Loyola's 440 relay team turned in a 42.7s. clocking in practice yesterday for the Fresno relay classic. The team consisted of Bob Boyd, John Celentano, Leo Newman and Lloyd LaBeach. The quartet will compete unattached at Fresno because of LaBeach's ineligibility.
