

Stanford Upsets SC in Relays at Modesto

MODESTO, May 20 (AP)—Stanford scored 45 points tonight to win the ninth annual California Relays team championship in a meet that finally saw University of Southern California's domination of West Coast track and field finally broken.

The SC Trojans finished second with 40 1/3 points. Bad luck dogged the Trojans who finished second in the 440-yard relay and were disqualified for an illegal pass of the baton.

Another Tough Break

Another tough break cost SC tallies in the 880-yard relay when its anchor man, John Bradley, cramped a leg muscle and had to quit the race. He was leading Stanford's Gay Bryan by a stride when the accident befell him some 150 yards from the finish.

Gay Bryan and Don Anderson, California, tied for individual

high-point scoring with 7 each. Bryan took third in the broad jump and ran in two sprint relays, each netting him 2 1/2 tallies. Anderson won the 100-yard dash and ran in two sprint relays for 1 point each, his team finishing third.

Stanford Freshman Bob Mathias was high-point man in the junior college-freshman class with 17 1/2, followed by John Simmons, San Mateo JC, with 15.

Mathias' Wins

Mathias, national decathlon champ, won the discus and high hurdles; placed second in the shot-put and third in the high jump. He also ran in two sprints relays. Simmons won the broad jump and 100-yard dash and ran laps in the 440 and 880-yard relays.

SC SPIKERS UPSET AT MODESTO EVENT

Atlesey of SC, who bettered the world's 120-yard high hurdles record at Fresno a week ago, won his specialty with ease.

The tall Trojan skimmed the sticks in 13.9s., equaling the time he posted in winning his heat and also this event last night in the Coliseum Relays.

At Fresno he was clocked in 13.5s., bettering the official mark held by Harrison Dillard, former Baldwin-Wallace speedster, by one-tenth of a second.

Six Yards Ahead

Atlesey led Horace Smith of Michigan State to the tape by some six yards. The latter had won the second heat in 14.1s.

Bob Mathias, Stanford's all-around freshman star, won the junior college-freshman division high hurdles event in 14.5s., fastest time yet for him. The muscular youngster, American and Olympic decathlon champion, turned in a series of good performances this afternoon. He won the discus throw at 151ft. 3in.; took second in the shot-put with 49ft. 6in. and third in the high jump with 6ft. 1 5/8in.

The high hurdles win tonight climaxed the one-man show.

Gov. Earl Warren was the honorary referee for the ninth relays here. Charles Hunter of San Francisco was the official referet. A crowd estimated at 7200 attended.

SC Snaps Record

Southern California distance medley team won the event in the relays record-breaking time of 10m. 01s. Jim Newcomb, an Indian youth from Portland, Or., ran the anchor mile in 4m. 12.6s. to give the Trojan quartet a time only 1.4s. slower than the world's record set in 1938 by North Texas Teachers College.

Newcomb's teammates were Curry, running 440 yards; Wehking, 880 yards, and Baillie, 1320 yards. The former relays record was 10m. 17.5s. made by California last year.

Big Otis Chandler of Stanford, one of the best shot-putters in the country, heaved the iron ball 55ft. 1 1/4in. for a new Relays record. Wilbur (Moose) Thompson of the Los Angeles AC, who set the old mark of 54ft. 7 1/4in., placed second tonight at 53ft. 1/2in.
