The tall Trojan skimmed the sticks in 13.9s., equaling the time he posted in winning his sticks heat and also this event last night in the Coliseum Relays. At Fresno he was clocked in

13.58. , bettering the official mark held by Harrison Dillard, former Baldwin-Wallace speedster, by one-tenth of a second.

### Six Yards Ahead

Bob Mathias, Stanford's all-round freshman star, won the junior college-freshman division high hurdles event in 14.5s., fastest time yet for him. ### SC Snaps Record

Southern California distance medley team won the event in the relays record-breaking time of 10m. 01s. Jim Newcomb, an Indian youth from Portland, Or., ran the anchor mile in 4m, 12.6s, to give the Trojan guartet a time only 1.4s, slower than the world's record set in 1938 by North Texas Teachers College.

Newcomb's teammates Curry, running 440 yards; Weh-king, 880 yards, and Bailie, 1320 vards. The former relays record was 10m. 17.5s. made by Califor nia last year.
