

Troy Senior Clips Record at Fresno

Team Title Won by Trojans With Stanford Second

FRESNO May 13 — SC's Dick Attlesey, who set a new world record in the 120-yard high hurdles, was the big noise in the West Coast Relays here today as the SC Trojans registered their 18th team triumph in the 24-year-old history of the Raisin City classic.

The Trojans racked up 75½ points to edge Stanford's fightin' Injuns, who came through with 67½ points.

Attlesey, who almost gave up hurdling two years ago because of a constant string of injuries, racked up the new mark in the first heat of the 120 highs this afternoon under a blazing Fresno sun.

Finals in 14s.

He returned in the evening to nab the finals in 14s., still a 10th of a second under the West Coast Relays record of 14.1s. held by UCLA's Craig Dixon.

In the early afternoon heat, Attlesey finished seven yards ahead of the Olympic Club's Downing McKee, who was clocked in 14.2s. in the final. The former Bell High School star was just four yards to the good as he hit the tape.

In his world record performance Attlesey was aided by a 4.435 m.p.h. just under the allowable maximum of 4.473 m.p.h. Amos Alonzo Stagg, meet referee, certified the mark as official when the course proved to be exactly 120 yards long when measured.

16th World Mark

The 21-year-old Trojan senior's mark was the 16th set in 24 years of West Coast Relays. It was the ninth world standard recorded by Trojan tracksters here.

Attlesey, a 6-foot 4-inch 190-pounder, said after the race that he knew it was the fastest race he'd ever run but "could hardly believe the time."

"It's funny I did so well. I've been in a school play the past week and I've been standing on my feet for three straight nights," Attlesey said. He was up after midnight every night the past week because of his dramatics.

Tall, Tan, Terrific

But the tall, tan, terrific Trojan appeared to be in the pink of condition as he glided over the barriers in his heat with the brestest of ease. Two of the three official timers caught him in 13.5s., another in 13.6s.

The Trojans continued their winning ways in the first relay event on the card—the distance medley. Bud Curry (440), Bobby Mitchell (880), John Cherry (1320) got Jim Newcomb off to a lead of 25 yards to start the mile.

And the chief was 45 yards ahead of Mello of California when he broke the tape in 10m. 12.4s. Newcomb was timed in 4m. 21s.

ATTLESEY SETS WORLD MARK

In his seemingly effortless four-lap job.

Donnie Anderson, third of the famed Pasadena sprint family, upset favored Lloyd LaBeach, the Panama Flier, in the open 100-yard dash. LaBeach was out of his tracks fast to get an early lead on the Bear speedster, but Donnie blazed in the final 20 yards to triumph. Stanford's Ronnie Buck, an in-and-out'er all season long, finished third. Time was 9.5s.

Otis Chandler, the handsome husky from Stanford, outtossed Wilbur Thompson, Olympic Games shot-put champ, with a mighty heave of 54ft. 10 1/2 in., seven and one-half inches ahead of Thompson. Parry O'Brien, the SC frosh star, bagged third spot when he threw the 16-pound bulb 52ft. 8 3/4 in. It marked the fourth time this season O'Brien has cracked the SC frosh record.

Mild Upset

Stanford turned in a mild upset in the 440-yard relay when the Indian blazers cut down the Trojans with a 41s. flat triumph, just five-tenths of a second off the world mark. Wilbur Taylor's third 110 yards did the job. He left SC's Al Mejia three yards back and Gay Bryan breezed home five yards to the good over Johnny Bradley.

Jerome Biffle, Denver's one-man track team, got off one of the evening's top marks when he flew through the air 25ft. 7 1/4 in. to finish ahead of Stanford's hard-working Bryan, second at 25ft. 1 1/2 in., in the broad jump.

UCLA's Cy Young upset Bud Held of Stanford in the javelin, capturing the event at 216ft. 3 1/2 in. California's George Roseme was out of action with an injured leg.

The Trojan sprinters got revenge for their upset loss in the 440-yard relay when the SC speed merchants, helped no little by a tremendous 220 by Norm Stocks, managed to nip the Indians in the 880 relay. Stanford's Bryan almost upset the Trojan horse when he made three yards on Bradley, but the SC sophomore was two yards to the good at the finish.

Field Day

The judges had a field day in the two-mile relay, first giving the race to the Trojans, who won by a wide margin, then disqualifying SC and finally winding up by handing the Trojans second place behind UCLA.

The hassle arose from a collision between SC's Bob Pruitt and UCLA's Jack Miller on the final turn of the last lap of the two-mile relay. Pruitt, one yard behind Miller, knocked down the Bruin trying to cut in. Miller managed to pick himself up and finished, but Pruitt crossed the final stripe 30 yards to the good.

The judges then announced the Trojans winners in 7m. 43.6s., but announced the disqualification when Pruitt came to the officials and said he had knocked down Miller.

Amos Alonzo Stagg, meet referee, awarded the Trojans second place in the event behind the Bruins, because the other teams, Stanford and California, were so far back they had no chance to score ahead of SC.
